

# William Wallace Timeline Ordering Events

Can you rearrange these events in order from Wallace's life?

	<b>September 1297</b> The Battle of Stirling Bridge. Wallace led the Scots to victory through the use of clever tactics.
	<b>August 1305</b> Wallace was captured near Glasgow.
	<b>July 1298</b> Battle of Falkirk. The Scots were defeated by King Edward's army but William Wallace is able to escape.
	<b>c.1270</b> William Wallace was born either in Elderslie in Renfrewshire or Derwent Park in Kilmarnock.
	<b>1861 – 1869</b> The Wallace monument was built on Abbey Craig in Stirling.
	<b>23rd August, 1305</b> Wallace is tried and found guilty of treason. He is hung, drawn and quartered. His head was put on London Bridge and his limbs were spread between Newcastle, Berwick, Stirling and Perth.
	<b>c.1477</b> A historian called Blind Harry wrote an epic poem about Wallace transforming people's views about Wallace.
	<b>1297</b> Wallace led an attack on Lanark, killing an English sheriff in the process.
	<b>Late 1298</b> William resigned the guardianship and went abroad to try and gain support for the Scottish cause.
	<b>1995</b> The film <i>Braveheart</i> was released telling the tale of Wallace's life.
	<b>Late 1297 – Early 1298</b> William was knighted by John Balliol and appointed 'Guardian of the Kingdom'.
	<b>1303</b> William Wallace returned to Scotland.
