





In acceptage, accounted when your child will be studying the correct subjects at the correct level, the form provides details of the predicted National Qualification levels for your child based on their latest and best evidence of progress in \$3.

Your child will meet with their Principal Teacher of Pupil Support (PTPS) to discuss this process and their options based on their career aspirations and current progress levels. Through the <u>discussion</u> a rating of one to six will be allocated to their preferred subject choices.

#### Please advice note below:

- . Ratings from 1 5 with 1 being the subject your child wants to continue with most,
- · Maths and English are both compulsory subjects and are already selected,
- . Rating 6 being an alternative in case other subjects are not available,
- If selecting a college option that is delivered at Ayrshire College please be aware
  of the commitment and logistics required to attend this,
- · College places are subject to a competitive selection process, and
- . Pupil should not select any subject which they have not studied in \$3

We will endeavour to ensure that pupils get their preferred options choices. However, all courses gre, affered subject to availability of staff and to sections being of a viable size.

Completed forms signed by Parents & Carers <u>must be returned</u> to Principal Teachers of Pupil Support by 15:40 on Wednesday 7 February 2024. Pupils will complete the process in PSE classes using an online form.



SDS are in schools to help young people understand the world of work.


