It's Been A Very Odd Year Continuing With Virtual Meetings From The End Of The Last Session And The Support Contributed Both Virtually And In Person From Everyone Has Been Appreciated. I'd Like To Also Like To Thank Allison, Cara, Lorraine And Mrs Mcharg For All Of Their Support And Advice To The Parent Council Over The Last Year Keeping Us Updated, Answering Any Questions And Letting Us Into The Parent Council Cupboard ... A Lot! Due To Covid We Had To Do Things Very Differently This Year, No Discos And No Christmas Fayre Instead Providing Snack Bags For Halloween Supported By Tescos In Auchinleck And Gillian's In		Chair

<p>Mauchline And Taking Forward The Letter To Santa Project Which Was Well Supported By The Parents With 152 Letters And Presents Going Out To Kids Across The Ecc And Ps. We Also Had A Very Successful Uptake In Our Christmas Card Project This Year And We Also Supported The School Through Christmas Snack Bags For The Class Parties And Also Snack Bags For Christmas Movie Days.</p> <p>Towards The End Of The Year The Parent Council Consulted With Both The Children's Leadership Council And The Ecc Staff To Ask Them What They Thought Some Of The Fundraising Money Should Be Spent On. Information Came Back Advising That They Would Like More Picnic Benches And A Variety Of Outdoor Equipment Including Boxes Of Outdoor Toys, Pop Up Tents And Board Games And For The Ecc An Outdoor Handwashing Station And Some Outdoor Bags For Activities To Be Kept In. The Outdoor Project Was Supported By A Number Of Local Businesses Which Are Listed In The Treasurer's Report And We Would Like To Note Thanks To Them For Their Support. The Parent Council Have Also Linked With Ayrshire College To Create A New Buddy Bench For The Playground Made By Joinery Students. All Of The Equipment Will Have Been Passed Over To The School And Ecc By The End Of Term.</p> <p>Due To The Closure Of Auchinleck Academy, The Parent Council Gained Access To The Building And Were Able To Reuse A Number Of Equipment Which Was Not Taken To The New Campus. This Included Stools, And Large Outdoor Bean Bags For The Outdoor Project, Kitchen Bowls And Pots For The Ecc Mud Kitchen And A Number Of Catering Cups / Paper Plates Which Can Be Used Within The Next Session.</p> <p>As Per Tradition The Parent Council Have Purchased New Ties For P7 Leavers And New Gym Bags For All Mauchline Ecc Kids Going Into Primary 1. These Will Be Passed Over To The School To Give To The Children Due To Covid Measures In Place. In Addition To School Ties For P7s The Parent Council Also Purchased Stationery Sets This Year Supported By Tesco Auchinleck.</p> <p>The Final Project For The Year Was The Creation Of A Mauchline Primary School And Ecc Recipe Book. A Total Of 62 Recipes Were Received From Both Children And Staff Within The Ecc And School. The Parent Council Also Ran A Competition For A Front Cover With The Winner Receiving A Free Copy. There Were 133 Entries Which Was So Difficult To Narrow Down We Decided One 1 For The Front Cover And A Further 16 Which Were Shrunk Down And Merged To Create A Back Cover. Certificates Will Be Provided To All Children Who Entered. The Books Will Be Sold After This Agm Therefore An Update Will Be Made Available At The First Meeting Of The New Session In Relation To This.</p> <p>In Closing, For A Difficult Year We Managed To Squeeze In A Significant Amount Of Work And I Just Want To Thank Everyone Again For Their Support To Enable This To Happen. 10.	<p>Head Teachers Report</p> <p style="text-align: center;">End Of School Session 2020/21</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Monday 14th June 2021</p> <p><u>Ecc Update</u></p> <p>Our Outdoor Champion Undertook A 6 Week Block Of Virtual Natural School Which Was Delivered To Outdoor Champions Across The Whole Of Scotland. The Ecc Have Now Been Awarded Our Virtual Nature School Award.</p> <p>For The Month Of June, We Have Been Providing The Children With A Variety Of Learning Experiences In Relation To Our Transition Topic, Stick Man. This Topic Will Be Carried On For The First Two Weeks Of The Children Attending Primary One As Part Of Their Transition Topic.</p> <p>The Pre-school Children From Both Bubbles Have Had The Opportunity To Visit The Primary One Playground Weekly To Become Familiar With The Surroundings Of The Playground And They Have Also Had Two Planned Experiences Where They Got To Meet Their Primary One Teacher For A Story In The Playground.</p> <p>The Children And Staff Have Been Working Hard On The Graduation Which Will Be Published On Thursday 17th June.</p> <p>Under The Circumstances Due To Covid-19, All Children In The Ecc Have Adapted Really Well To These Changes And All Pre-school Children Have Coped Well With Transition And Are All Ready For Primary One.</p> <p>All Children Are Thoroughly Enjoying Fantastic Fridays Where They Are Able To Participate In A Variety Of Different Games And Dances.</p> <p>The Outdoor Area Has Been Further Developed With Logs And Chips From Eggar And Pipes Sourced From A Member Of The Parent Council. The Parent Council Have Also Bought An Outdoor Sink For The Ecc Which Is Very Useful In Providing A Hand Washing Facility Outdoors, Allowing Staff To Be Able To Provide Snack Outdoors. It Is Clear To See The Children In The Ecc Are Thriving From Outdoor Play Opportunities.</p> <p>Kay A Speech And Language Support Assistant Has Been Attending The Ecc Every Wednesday To Support With The Communication Friendly Environment Accreditation.</p>

Our Paths Champion Has Undertook Paths Small Group Activities With The Pre-school Children, Linking With The Paths Learning Experiences The Children Will Receive In Primary One.

A Ballot Took Place Centrally This Year For The Ecc As We Were Oversubscribed With Applications And Only Able To Allocate 40 Places. All Children Who Were Successful In The Ballot Have Now Been Allocated Their Place. Children Starting The Ecc In August, Their Parents Have Been Informed Of The Child's Group And Keyworker.

School Improvements And Use Of Pef Spending

Paths-update From Miss Millar

Paths Is Continuing To Be Embedded Throughout The School. Pupils Will Begin To Work On 'moving On' Lessons As We Near The End Of The Session.

1-1 Teacher Meetings Took Place In April.

P6 Pupils Will Be Trained As 'buddies' For When They Move Into P7. This Will Help Reinforce Messages Taught In Paths Lessons In The Playground.

Covid Recovery- Update From Miss Kirkcaldy (Acting Principal Teacher)

Miss Kirkcaldy Is Currently Working With A Group Of P3 Children Identified As Needing Support For Numeracy. Support Is Provided Through The Number Box Resource. Ms Neilson Is Working With Groups Of P3 Children Focusing On Developing Literacy Skills, Specifically Spelling Common Words Using The Active Literacy Programme. Groups Of P6 Children Are Supported To Develop Skills In Numeracy, Including Number Processes, Information Handling And Time. Children In P6 Are Also Working On Developing Literacy Skills With A Specific Focus On Reading. Groups Of P2 Children Are Supported To Develop Writing Skills, Specifically Looking At Vocabulary And Sentence Building. This Support Will Continue Until The Summer Holidays.

Maths- Update From Mrs Mckinlay (Principal Teacher)

Numeracy And Maths Have Been A Priority In Our School Improvement Plan Over The Last Session. As A School, We Have Invested In A Range Of Resources And Training Opportunities. We Have Introduced And Developed A Core Resource – Heinemann Active Maths. This Is An Activity-led Maths Programme, Created Specifically For Scottish Schools, With The Curriculum For Excellence And Active Learning At Its Heart. Ham Is A Fairly New Resource, Which Is Being Embedded In All Classrooms, But The Implementation Of This Has Been Interrupted By School Closures And Lockdown. This Will Continue To Be Developed Next Session.

We Have Also Worked Hard To Embed Number Talks Strategies In Every Class. This Allows The Children To Develop Their Mental Maths Skills And It Enables Children To Learn About Different Ways To Solve And Think About Problems.

Assessments Are Built In To Classroom Practice And Allow Teachers To Track And Monitor The Progress Being Made Regularly Throughout Each Session. This Is Discussed Regularly In Meetings With Slt.

All Teaching Staff Were Due To Participate In East Ayrshire Council Numeracy Training With Lynda Keith (National Numeracy And Mathematics Consultant) And The Sac Team This Session 2020/21. Unfortunately, This Was Again Interrupted Due To Covid And School Closures. All Staff At Mps Will Now Participate In Sac Numeracy Training In Session 21/22. The 'raising Attainment In Numeracy' Programme Contains Very Clear

	<p>Methodology And Strategies For Teachers And Pupils Which Supports Consistency In Learning And Teaching And Increased Attainment.</p> <p>The Children Also Have Regular Opportunities To Access Digital Learning Platforms. All Children Created Password Passports To Allow Home Access To The Digital Platforms For Homework And During Remote Learning.</p> <p><u>Literacy - Update From Mrs Cross Depute Head Teacher</u></p> <p>Our Whole School Focus On Using The Eac Active Literacy Programme Continues To Be Our Main Priority And Has Involved Refresher Training For Staff Moving Stages And The Use Of The Teaching Materials During The Period Of School Closure And Self-isolation. New Initiatives Are Being Rolled Out Next Session And Staff Will All Take Part In The Training. Eac Also Funded A Local Digital Reading Resource Called Giglets Which Will Be Further Developed Next Session Also. The School Have Used Pef Money To Secure Accelerated Reader And Myon For The Next Two (Hopefully Three) Years. Clicker 7 Continues To Be Implemented Throughout The School As A Resource Aimed To Help Children Who Need A Little Extra Support With Their Writing, However All Children Can Access The Resource. Nessy Reading And Spelling Continues For All Children From P3-p7. Some P2s Have Begun To Access The Licences That P7 Have Finished With And This Will Roll Out Again In The New Session.</p> <p><u>Digital - Update From Mrs Cross Depute Head Teacher</u></p> <p>All Children In P3-7 Continue To Have Access To Glow And All The Resources That This Provides E.G. Office 365 (Word, Powerpoint, Sway Etc). All Staff Are Incorporating Digital Literacy Into Their Teaching. This Means Developing The Children's Understanding Of The Digital World Around Them, Including Advantages And Disadvantages Of The Technologies Available. Staff Have Made Constant Use Of The Blog And Class Pages To Provide Information And Home Learning Whenever Required.
