School Attendance

Where possible all medical or dental appointments should be made outwith school hours. However, if your child has an appointment please put this in writing to his/her class teacher and collect / return your child from the main office for such appointments.

In particular holidays taken during term time are recorded as **Unauthorised Absence** on pupil records. Reasons such as *cost, parental holiday dates, weather conditions or availability of accommodation or travel arrangements,* are **not** considered valid reasons for holidays in term time. The Head Teacher cannot give permission for holidays taken during term time. The school does not provide work for holidays during term time.

Please inform the school by letter if your child is likely to be absent for some time and a note to be sent on his/her return confirming the reason for absence.

Absence from School

Schools are becoming increasingly vigilant about informing parents of absence from school. We operate a system where we will contact the main parent/carer of pupils for whom there is an unexplained absence after 9:30am. It is therefore very important for the safety of your child that;

 If your child is absent from school for <u>any reason</u> please phone the school on <u>01290 550306</u> before 9:30am.

Emergency Closures

In the event of an emergency affecting the school, East Ayrshire Council have well established procedures in place to cope with almost all situations:

- Notification on School APP
- Group Texts will be sent out to parents/ carers to advise of an emergency.
- The Council's Communications Team work quickly to update the Council website, Facebook and Twitter with the latest developments and advice on what to do.
- The team also work closely with Westsound Radio (DAB 11B, MW 1035) and West FM (96.7, 97.5 and 106.7) and statements and updates are issued frequently.

ParentPay

Mauchline Primary School is a cashless school. Payment for **school meals, school trips, tickets for school concerts etc**. are now all paid through ParentPay.

All pupils have been given a letter with a Parents activation code and if you have not already registered – please do so now. If you have lost your activation details, or have any problems activating your account, please contact the school office.

If you do not have access to the Internet and wish to pay for **school meals**, **school trips etc**. please contact the school office who will give

you information on how to pay cash by Paypoint at local convenience stores.

Expansion of Universal Free School Meals

In January 2022, free school meals were introduced for P5 children. This means a two-course meal is provided to all children from P1 to P5.

Information regarding the roll out of free school meals to the remaining year groups (P6 and P7) will be provided in 2022.

Note: Free School Meals (FSM) and Infant Free School Meals (UiFSM) are automatically calculated and will reduce the 'Payment due' value where appropriate. In most cases this will show a zero cost.

Free School Meals & Clothing Grant

The application process for school clothing grants and free school meals has changed. All applications must be made online – and this can be done from a smart phone, PC, laptop or tablet. If you, or someone you know does not have online access, please call *01563 554400* (*option 3*) and a member of staff will complete the form over the phone on your behalf.

To apply for Clothing Grants and Free School Meals you will need to register for an '*Our East Ayrshire Account'*.

School Transport

Free Transport - We will provide free transport for all primary pupils who live 1.5 miles or more from their local primary school (by the recognised shortest suitable walking distance) and to secondary pupils who live 3 miles or more from their local secondary school (by the recognised shortest suitable walking distance). This policy remains more generous than that prescribed by statute and may be reviewed at any time.

Free transport may also be available on the grounds of a medical condition or in cases where a family has moved house at a critical stage of education.

If you feel your child qualifies for free school travel and you wish to take advantage of this option, please fill in the Online School Transport Application.

<u>Privilege Seat Transport</u> - Subsidised privilege seats may be available, if there is spare capacity on existing school transport contracts. If you feel your child qualifies for a privilege seat and you wish to take advantage of this option, please fill in the Online School Transport Application.

Should your child suffer an injury which results in a short-term requirement for transport to and from school, it may be possible to arrange this. In the first instance, please contact your child's school. Please note that a letter from their doctor may be required.

Snacks

As a health promoting school, we encourage children to eat healthily at snack times and lunchtimes and would urge parents/ carers to support this. Children should bring one healthy snack *e.g. fruit, vegetables or oatcakes* and a bottle of water to drink in the class – no fizzy drinks!

Packed Lunches

Pupils who bring packed lunches eat their meals in the dining hall. Primary 4 to 7 pupils have the option of eating their packed lunch outside in the playground using one of the picnic benches. Parents/carers are asked to inform the office about any special diet requirements prescribed for medical reasons. As a number of children in any school suffer from a nut allergy, a potentially fatal condition, we ask all parents/carers that **NO NUTS** are given this includes **Nutella spread, peanut butter, chocolate bars containing nuts (e.g. Snickers).** Children, apart from those who travel home for lunch, are **NOT** permitted to leave school premises at lunchtime.

Medical & Health Care

It is essential that parents/ carers advise the school of any medical requirements that their child may have. Please note that medication can only be administered when the official paperwork has been completed and will be at the discretion of the Head Teacher.

Routine medication <u>will not be administered by the school.</u> This includes *antibiotics*, *cough bottles*, *painkillers*, *cream*, *eye/ear/nose drops*. Antibiotics can be given to pupils before and after school and if it is required to take a dose at lunchtime, parent/carer can contact office to arrange a suitable time to attend.

Please do not send in any medication in your child's bag

First Aid

If your child receives first aid for a minor injury during school, your child will be given an illness report slip with a brief description of the injury and first aid treatment administered. In the event of a head injury/serious injury parent or designated emergency contact will be informed by telephone.

Uniform

Our school uniform is very smart and it is hoped that parents will encourage their children to wear the school uniform, as there are a number of reasons why it is important;

• **Security** - intruders are easily identified

• Appearance - uniform presents a smart image for pupils

Confidence - pupils need not worry that they have the most

fashionable clothing, or a large number of

• **Bullying** - pupils will not be picked on because of their

clothing. For this reason football tops etc. are

Items of clothing can be purchased throughout the school year from Blu Design in Mauchline. Please make sure that all clothing is <u>clearly</u> marked with the child's name. We do have a lost property box, so please do ask if your child has lost an article of clothing.

<u>Valuable Items should be left at home</u> - The school cannot be responsible for the personal property of pupils. Pupils should not bring valuable items to school, or wear expensive items of clothing/jewellery. We do not have insurance to cover for pupil property. If items are lost, damaged or stolen it is highly unlikely that any compensation will be paid unless the authority has been negligent in some way.

Mobile phones

Pupils are not permitted to make use of mobile technologies within our school grounds. If a pupil does require to bring their mobile phone to school, it should be switched off before entering the playground and handed to the class teacher for safe keeping until 3:00pm when it will be returned. Mobile phones should remain in the pupil's school bag until they have left the school grounds.

 Apple Watches are no longer permitted and should not be worn to school.

If a mobile phone/Apple watch or other device with cellular technologies is on and being used during the school day it will be confiscated with a parent/carer being contacted to arrange safe collection of the device.

Gym Kit

You will need; a gym bag to keep your gym kit in school. (This will be gifted to new P1 pupils starting in August)

In the interest of health and safety, shorts and gym shoes should be worn for P.E. lessons to allow the children to take part fully in the activities of the class. "The Physical Education Code of Practice 2.5" forbids the wearing of jewellery. Pierced earrings <u>must</u> be removed. It is helpful if younger pupils do not wear earrings on gym days.

Homework

Class teachers will confirm homework details on return to school.

Homework should take no more than 20–30 minutes. Parents/ carers are asked to check that work is done carefully and neatly.

Homework is provided for a number of different reasons:-

• to provide more practice and consolidation of work done in school

- to encourage each child to become an independent learner
- to allow parents/ carers to share in their child's learning
- to have a mutually acceptable contract between child, parent and school

If you are experiencing any difficulties with homework activities or the time taken to complete please contact the school.

Religious Observance

All pupils attend regular assemblies at which the school chaplain may officiate. The theme of an assembly will be morally uplifting in nature and may include both prayer and Biblical references. In addition, there are formal religious assemblies at Christmas and Easter which include specifically Christian references and bible readings. Parents/ carers have the right to withdraw children from religious education and services. If they wish to do so, the Head Teacher should be informed in writing.
