- Create a questionnaire with tally marks to record the favourite sea creatures of your friends and family.
- Use your questionnaire results to draw a pictogram.
- Find out the combined length of five different underwater creatures, then double it.
- Calculate the price of a family visit to a local sea life centre.



Out and About!

- With an adult, explore a place that has water such as a pond, loch, river, sea life centre or the seaside.
- Visit someone who has an aquarium or even just a goldfish! Observe the animals.
- Create your own pond using a bucket or basin of water. Can you create creatures or plants to put in your pond?



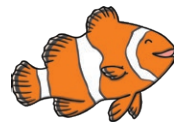
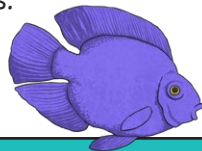
Literacy

- Create a snap game to play with a partner by drawing 4 different sea creatures on pieces of card. Draw each creature 5 times.
- Work with a friend to design, draw and label a boat or submarine.

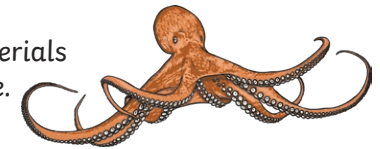


Homework Choice Grid Under the Sea



Expressive Arts

- Sand art! Use food colouring to colour sand. Can you make a picture with the coloured sand?
- Learn and perform a song with a sea theme.
- Act out a scene from your favourite sea themed movie.
- Use different art materials to make a sea collage.



Let's Get Technical!

- Make a boat and see if it floats in the sink or bathtub.
- Complete a float-or-sink experiment in your sink or bathtub with ten household items.
- Create a fishing rod. Try to 'catch' some household items.
- Use the Internet to search for pictures of sea creatures.



Health and Wellbeing

- Make a list of ways to look after the sea.
- Make a fish recipe.
- Play 'guess the animal' by moving like a sea creature and have your friend guess which one it is.
- Make a list of ways to stay safe when you are near water, like at the seaside.



Social Studies

- Write a fact file about your favourite sea creature.
- Draw a map of a river from its source to the sea. Label the features of land on its journey, such as hills and waterfalls.
- List the types of weather and extreme weather that is connected to water.
- Name the world's oceans and seas on a map.
