Focus in term one: understand emotions

Through our PATHS we encourage children to:

- ✓ Talk about their emotions
- ✓ Develop strategies for managing emotions



We have also been exploring our feelings through the book The Colour Monster, and through check-ins on how we are feeling.

Within the classroom we also have our Calm corner where pupils are able to access throughout the day.

A small reminder we are nut-free school as we do have pupils with allergies.



Literacy

- •Within literacy we will be continuing developing our knowledge of phonics. Introducing a new sound every week which link to our spelling words.
- •We will also develop our common word recognition and use these words to build sentences.
- •For reading we are building our skills from our Bug Club texts and later in the year introduce a class novel.
- •A weekly focus on handwriting and forming our letters correctly.
- •In literacy we are developing our skills through a variety of "Must Do Jobs", which vary every week but can include active materials such as magnetic letters, games on ipads/laptops, play dough. "Must Do Jobs" can vary from practising spelling, reading Books, building words and letter formation.



Maths

Maths will consist of making sense of numbers using practical materials such as cubes, numicon. Using concrete materials can help make sense of abstract number concepts.

This term we will be focusing on place value.

Understanding tens and units helps to build a good base as we work with numbers 0-99.

Pupils will be involved in a range on activities through their maths "Must Do Jobs", including jotter tasks, using lego and cubes to build and create numbers, interactive online games and quick fire sums.

Religious Education

- We will look at different themes throughout the year
- In term 1 our themes will be prayer, routines of the church and celebration of Mass
- We will use bible stories with moral lessons and link these to our H&WB/PATHs inputs
- We will have Mass at Mount Carmel Church regularly, celebrating the first Friday of the month and on Holy Days of Obligation.

PE

Our PE days are Tuesday and Thursday.

This term we will be focusing on development games, large ball skills and football.

Please ensure your child has a change of clothes, which includes shorts and t-shirt (if child is wearing a shirt that day).

Can children also bring a change of shoes that they are able to put on themselves, for example sandshoes or trainers with Velcro if they are not confident tying laces yet.

Please remember no earrings on PE days.

Homework

Homework is useful for:

- ✓ reinforcing the learning that is taking place in the classroom
- ✓ aiding retention of the learning taking place
- ✓ reinforcing reading skills needed in class
- ✓ quick recall of number work, aiding addition/subtraction facts and number bonds

- We are a Rights Respecting School (RRS)

Rainbow Reward

We use a traffic light system, similar to that used in our PATHs programme

The children have 3 opportunities to correct low level interruptions before being moved from green to amber

They then have a further 3 opportunities to correct behaviour before being moved to red

If moved to red, children will lose a portion of their reward play

If this becomes a daily occurrence, children will lose all reward play

Reward play is free play which takes place on a Wednesday and Friday (20-30 minutes each session)



Our Classroom



As the new school year begins, we aim to create a happy, safe and nurturing classroom environment where all pupils are able to achieve and thrive in all aspects of the curriculum.

We have our class charter which we created on the first week of school which also links to our rights.
