Uniform

Please remember that full school uniform should be worn daily. Leggings and tracksuit bottoms are not part of our uniform, this should be skirts, shorts or trousers please. Remember to make sure that all items of uniform have been labelled including jackets. Unfortunately, it is very difficult to return lost items if these have not been labelled. Please remember that we also have many additional items in our uniform exchange. These are free and available all days that the school building is open.

Pupil Absence

If a child is going to be absent from school please contact the school by 9:15am providing details of the reason for absence. It is the parents/carers responsibility to make the school aware of this. Previously school staff would contact parents/carers if they did not contact the school. This can be a very time consuming activity for our clerical staff. Again, this is a parental responsibility and I urge you to speak with the office or leave a message.

Collection of Children

A reminder that our school day finishes at 3pm. We receive a number of phone calls daily requesting to collect children earlier than this via the front door. We have limited clerical staff and this places a huge pressure on them to organise this, often with very short notice. This should be used on rare occasions if children are required to be collected early for an appointment. Thank you for your support with this matter.

Please see the information below detailing when each class will take part in PE activities. Children get changed in school for PE, do not send children to school in their PE clothes. PE kit can include a blue polo shirt or blue t-shirt, black shorts/leggings/tracksuit bottoms and suitable trainers. It is easier if these items are left is school in a bag on their peg. Please remember that no jewellery should be worn on PE days, including earrings. If your child is not taking part in PE due to medical reasons please contact the school. It is expected that all children will take part in PE tasks, if a child has forgotten items we shall aim to provide suitable items for them to borrow for that day.

Breakfast Club/Free Toast and Fruit/School Lunches/Snacks

As you are aware our Breakfast Club has returned as of Monday 21st August. We had a number of requests for this, unfortunately we are already at capacity with a waiting list in place.

Pupils can continue to access free toast each morning, this is available for P4-7 in the main hall and P1-3 can access a tray in the playground. This will begin on Monday 28th August. Children can continue to access a free piece of fruit daily for snack. This is available in each class.

Pupils in Primary 1-5 continue to receive free school lunches. You are able to see lunch menus on the council website as well as our school app. It would be helpful if you could

discuss lunch choices with children before they come to school so that lunches can be easily ordered in the morning.

For children in Primary 6 and 7 East Ayrshire have introduced a lunchtime School Meal Crunch Deal for just £1.08. The deal will run from August 2023 to June 2024 and will be available to young people who pay for their school meals. Going forward could you please make sure that you have money available in your child's account to pay for their school meal. A text message will be sent if no money has been in the account to remind you to pay this and to top up your balance.

A reminder that we are a nut free school, please do not send your child with items to school which may contain nuts as we have children with severe nut allergies. As a Health Promoting School please continue to consider carefully the snacks that are being sent to school. Fruit, breakfast bars, vegetables or a small packet of crisps is acceptable. Please do not send large packs of crisps or large chocolate bars to school. Sweets should be an occasional treat, not a daily snack. Please continue to send water bottles to school, these should not contain juice or flavoured water.

A message from Kim Cameron – Financial Inclusion Team



Do you know?

Those who meet certain qualifying criteria can apply for Free School Meals and a Clothing Grant!

Free School Meals

You may qualify even if you are working, if you have a low income and meet qualifying benefit levels.

All pupils in Primary 1 to Primary 5 and specialist provision centres will receive free school meals. However, everyone should also apply when they meet low-income criteria, from Primary 1 to Secondary Year 6, as you may also receive holiday entitlements too. If your child qualifies for Free School Meals then they would be entitled to receive a two course meal worth £2.15 per day.

Clothing Grant

If you qualify for a School Clothing Grant you are entitled to an award of £120 per child attending Primary School and £150 per child attending Secondary School. This is usually only paid once a year.

If your child continues with their studies into 5/6th year, any qualifying award for Free School Meals and/or Clothing Grant will not be finalised until they return in August 2023.
