Head Teacher Update

Welcome, to April's newsletter.

I hope you, your family and friends have enjoyed your Easter break.

As we move into our last term of session 2023/2024, I felt it would be helpful to share some more of our successes and achievements from last term, as well as provide some details of what this busy term has in store.

I am very pleased to share that our January to March term was a hugely successful one. Inspection

As you are aware, we welcomed Education Scotland into our school in January for an inspection. This process was an extremely positive experience and we were delighted to have achieved four 'very goods' across the following quality indicators:

Communication - Safer Schools App for Pupils

As you know, we are currently using the Safer Schools App as a means of communication with parents/carers. East Ayrshire Council would like to expand use of this to include pupils from P4 to P7. Pupils do not need to use a login, only a pin number which applies only to our school. The pupil pin number for our school is 5368.

The pupil section of the app offers age/stage appropriate content around cyber resilience, using the internet in a safer manner, online gaming and lots of content around wellbeing.

Pupils are invited to have the Safer Scotland app on their personal devices. The reason the app for pupils has been introduced to pupils from P4 to P7 is that 91% of pupils ages 9-12 years have a mobile phone and over 80% are using social media, even though

It would be great if all our young people could have this on their personal devices. The reason we've suggested P4+ is that 91% of pupils aged 9-12 years have a mobile phone, with over 80% using social media, despite the age requirement being 13 years and above.

If you would like your child to use the Safer Scotland app, please take a few moments to discuss the above with your child and then use the pin above to access it.

Homework and Respectful Relationships Consultation

This term, we will be carrying out a whole school consultation on homework and relationships and behaviour. This is to support ongoing self-evaluation and school improvements and to gain a wide range of views from our whole school community.

Over the coming weeks, you will be invited to complete a Form where you will be asked to share your views on homework. The aim is to update our Homework Policy and to have this in place for August 2024.

As we are in the process of refreshing our Respectful Relationship Policy, we would very much like to involve our parents/carers in the process too by asking you to complete a Form. Our Respectful Relationship Policy outlines how we support relationships and behaviour in line with East Ayrshire Council's Relationship Framework.

New School Gates

You may have noticed that we have new gates. This includes two vehicle gates and a pedestrian gate. The new gates will promote a safer school environment for our whole school community. These will be in use immediately. Please see the information below for times when our school community can access our playground out of school hours.

- The playground will be accessible after school every day until 6pm
- The playground will be accessible during school holidays during the day

The gates will be closed over between 9.20am and 9.30am each morning and will remain closed for the remainder of the day. This will mean that if your child is entering or leaving school between 9.20am and 3pm, you will be unable enter the school car park and entry to the school will be via the pedestrian gate only.

- At NRPS, we prioritise the importance of developing the skills and confidence our pupils need to ride a bike and cycle on the road safely. We do this through delivering the Bikeability Programme to as many pupils as possible. We are delighted to share that the Bikeability Level 1 took place last term and it was a huge success. We had many pupils who were non riders or who lacked confidence, and are now able to ride a bike confidently. Bikeability Level 2 will be taking place this term for our P6 pupils.
- We are delighted to announce that the sum of £294 was raised plus £350 through selling Red Noses for this amazing charity. The children had a brilliant day taking part in various activities! Please click on the link below to see what they got up to!




