




Our vision is understood and shared by everyone in our school community, with everyone striving to **Learn Today, Lead Tomorrow**.

## Parental Involvement and Engagement

Parents' involvement and engagement with their child's education and learning is crucial, therefore as a school we wish to actively involve you, the families and parents, as much as possible. Our school thrives on the partnership we build with you and our community.

## Personal Learning and Achievement

Personal learning and achievement is an essential part of a child's learning. It promotes skills for life and work as well as skills for learning, and can help in our young people being confident, highly motivated and engaged in school and their wider community.

To help celebrate what our children and young people learn outside of school, we will have six Personal Learning and Achievement Assemblies throughout this session. This will give your child the opportunity to share what they have learned, what skills they have developed and just anything they are proud of and want our whole school community to know.

Nether Robertland Primary School is situated in the town of Stewarton, at the heart of a very close community. It was built in 1973 and in 2023, the school celebrated its 50th anniversary. It is part of the Stewarton Education Group. Stewarton is a rural community situated six miles north of Kilmarnock. A number of children who attend the school live in the outskirts of the town and outlying farms and travel by bus or taxi. When children reach secondary age, they transfer to Stewarton Academy.

The school currently has 12 classes with a roll of 311 children. The building is semi-open plan, consisting of 14 classrooms, two flexible learning spaces, gym hall, dining area, GP area, library/music room, main office, Nurture space, staff room, staff base, Head Teacher office, DHT office and reception. The school is within an enclosed playground. It has a large playing field area, trim trail, sandpit and an outdoor classroom, making it perfect for outdoor learning opportunities.

# Enrolment

For children due to start school for the first time in August, registration will take place online in January. Details of placing request procedures can be obtained from the school office or from the East Ayrshire's Website. By contacting the Head Teacher arrangements may be made for parents wishing to visit Nether Robertland Primary School.

# Transitions

Transitions are the moves children make from ECC to Primary 1, from stage to stage, from Primary to Secondary and between schools. Transitions work well when children are supported before, during and after and where transfer of information is effective. In NRPS, we have clear and effective transitions processes which ensures all transitions go well. These processes allow for

professional dialogue and the passing on of information to ensure coherence and progression across the curriculum.

We have strong links with Nether Robertland Early Childhood Centre and Stewarton Academy. A programme for transition events take place each session. Children with additional support needs will have a Transition 1 meeting in P6 and a Transition 2 meeting in P7.

## Communication

We are keen to maintain excellent and open communication links with our families and have several ways in which we do this:

- App – To provide instant information which includes diary dates, messages, news items and ways to communicate with the school. You can also leave an absence message via the app.
- Blogs – The whole school Blog provides information about all aspects of our school. Our P1 and P2 classes have their own class Blogs and you will find the link to these from the whole school Blog in the menu tab.
- Teams – Pupils from P3 to P7 will be part of a class Team and this is where you will find class information including homework, class updates etc.
- X – To share successes and learning. Our Twitter handle is @NetherRob\_ps
- ParentPay – We operate an online payment service called ParentPay, allowing you to pay for trips, school meals and much more. This will be set when your child starts school.

## Making Contact

The school office can be contacted by telephone between 8.30am and 4.00pm each day. If a parent or carer has a matter they wish to discuss with the class teacher, they should contact the Head Teacher or Depute Head Teacher initially who will make the necessary arrangements. If a parent or carer has a complaint they should request a meeting with the Head Teacher or Depute Head Teacher in the first instance. If, after this meeting the matter is unresolved, parents/carers are requested to complete a complaint form which will be forwarded to the Authority. We hope that with open and honest communication any complaints can be resolved at school level.

## Attendance and Time Keeping

Attendance at school is of paramount importance to ensure opportunities for learning are maximised and your child succeeds in all aspects of school life. If your child is going to be absent from school for any reason you must telephone the school 01560 482035 giving the reason for absence. You can also use the school app to report an absence. If a child is absent and we have not had any communication, the school will follow this up by sending a text or calling home.

Parents/Carers are responsible for ensuring that your child attends regularly and arrives on time. Parents/Carers are also responsible for ensuring the safety of your child on their journeys to and from school, except when they are on any transport we provide. Regular and punctual attendance

is linked closely to achievement and staff will work with parents/carers to ensure that children can achieve their full potential.

Attendance and time keeping are monitored by the Head Teacher and will be followed up with parents/carer should any difficulties emerge on a six weekly basis throughout each session.

## **Illness or Accidents**

If we need to send your child home due to illness or an accident, we will contact you to make the relevant arrangements. In the event of illness or an accident which requires referral to the local Medical Practice and/or to the Accident and Emergency Services, parents/carers will be contacted.

Your child may have small accidents in school which may or may not require first aid. If your child has had an injury that requires you to know, such as a head injury, we will contact you.

## **Administration of Medicines**

Where it is considered that medication will need to be administered at school, medication should always be supplied by the parents/carers in its original packaging, labelled by the hospital or community pharmacist. This will ensure the expiry date and any specific instructions or storage requirements are available. Parents may need to obtain a separate prescription for medication to be taken and held at the school.

An administration of medicine form will be required to be completed and signed by parents/carers, in line with authority standards and procedures. The plan of care will be communicated with relevant staff and training will be provided if necessary.

## **Dress Code**

We encourage all children to wear school uniform and be proud ambassadors of NRPS. Our uniform comprises of:

- Purple school sweatshirt/cardigan
- White/purple polo shirt
- White shirt with school tie
- Grey/black school trousers/skirts/shorts
- Grey/purple tartan pinafore/skirt
- School shoes

We kindly ask that names are written on all items of clothing. PE kits should also be provided and in addition, earrings and other jewellery should be removed for PE.

## School Meals Service

The Schools (Health Promotion and Nutrition) Act 2007 sets out in detail the National Nutritional Food Standards. School Meals in East Ayrshire offer nutritionally balanced well-presented food in an environment that is sensitive to the needs of children. It offers a good lunchtime experience with an important break in the day away from the classroom, while still being in the safety of the school.

## Cashless Catering

Cashless catering systems are in place in all primary and secondary schools in East Ayrshire in conjunction with the Online School Payments. This means you will be able to pay for school meals and snacks using the Online Payment system and will be able to view your child's menu choices, as well as track their spending. Primary 1 to 5 pupils and other pupils who are entitled to free school meals will have their meal allowance added to their account every day. Primary 6 to 7 receive half price school meals.

## Online School Payments

A safe and secure system of online school payments has been introduced to all primary and secondary schools, removing the need for your child to carry cash. The payment service is being provided by ParentPay: <https://www.parentpay.com/>

ParentPay is a secure online payment system allowing parents to pay for school meals, educational visits and much more. Parents who do not have access to online facilities or wish to continue to pay in cash can do so by paying through Paypoint facilities at local shops.

Benefits for parents:

- Make payments whenever and wherever you like
- No need to worry about your child carrying cash to school
- Monitor and make payments by instalments for larger items such as school trips
- A single login for all your children regardless of which school they attend
- Alerts for low balances via email and/or SMS text

We encourage our families to go through lunch options the night before in order to ensure there is something on the menu your child will enjoy. Alternatively, your child can bring a packed lunch into school.

## Photography/Videoing

No unauthorised photography or videoing is allowed within the school premises without the permission of the head of establishment.

Parents/carers are asked to comply with the requests on photography and videoing at school/establishment events which will be published in relation to each individual event. Such requests are made of you solely to protect the interests of individual children and families.

## Rascals Out of School Care

Before school and after school care facilities are available and are housed in the main school building. "Rascals" before and after school care can be contacted on: 07949 334945.

## School Security

There are security systems in operation on each entrance to the school.

All parents/carers and visitors coming to the school should report to the office at the main entrance before going to any classroom or other area in the establishment. There they will sign the log-in book and be met by an appropriate member of staff. This will increase security and help with fire safety precautions. Visitor badges are issued by clerical staff and you will be informed about the Child Protection procedures.

In the interests of your child's safety, it is essential that you make a point of telling the school if your child is to be collected by someone not known to staff members. It is expected that a responsible adult will bring your child to and from school.

A Drop Off point at the front of the school is now in operation to try and alleviate traffic congestion first thing in the morning.

If your child is absent from school, parents/carers are requested to leave an absence message via the school app or telephone the school office on 01560 482035 before 9.15am. If your child is absent with no notification, you will receive a text message asking you to contact the school as soon as possible.
