Can you be a detective and look at the Phoneme stories to spot the au or ew words. You can highlight or circle them or simply point to them on the screen.		Speed writing- see how many times you can write out your common words in two minutes. Spelling quiz - ask someone to quiz you on your spelling words, then swap round! Give yourself a forfeit if you spell something wrong e.g. do a chicken dance/do the dishes!

Extn - Get creative, can you draw a jewel and write as many ew words on it? OR can you draw a haunted house and write as many au words on it?

Extn - Au/ew . Choose from either au wordsearch or ew real or nonsense words.

(You do not need to print if you don't have access to a printer, you can just write the words on a piece of paper).

Common words

Can you please help your child learn to **recognise** these words by writing them (bubble writing, colourful writing, squiggly writing, fancy writing) or with materials outside. Drawing a line around each word and looking at the shape of the word. Talking about tall and small letters. You can use your magnetic letters to say, make, read and write these words.

Writing

Talk about what you are going to write first and maybe draw a picture before you start to write. Remember each sentence has to have a capital letter, full stop and finger space. I would like to see you on one occasion link 2 sentences together using the word **and** or **because**. Remember to include the prompts we have been talking about in school:

When?

Who?

What?

Where?

How did I feel.?

Sounds

Say, make, break, blend, read and write using words from the list. Your child will be able to tell you what to do! Don't show your child the word, just say it to them. Use the magnetic board.
