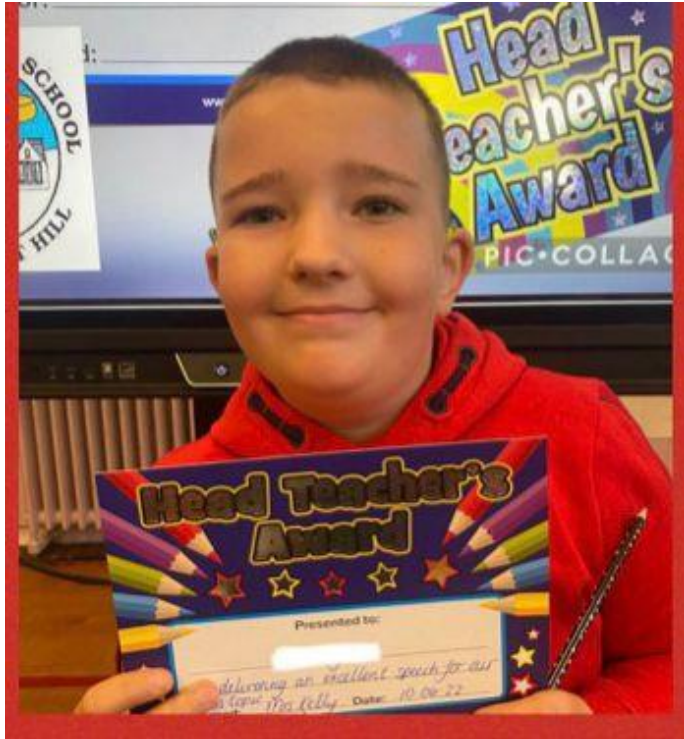

David (S2) from Park School pictured here with his medal from the Secondary Football Tournament. Well played, David!



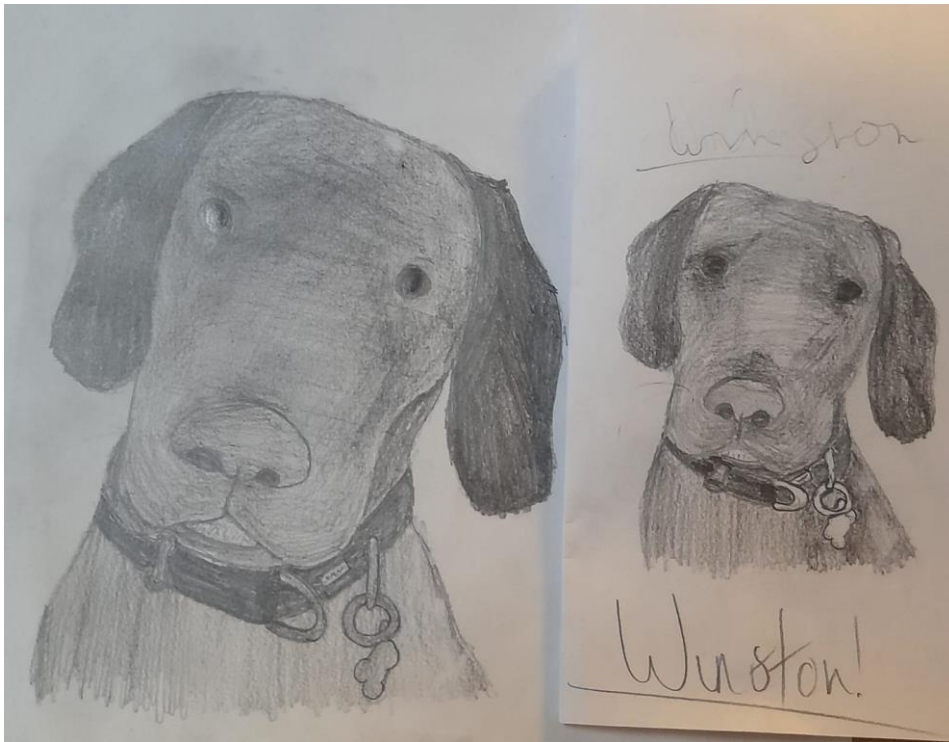
Demi (S6) from Greenwood Academy painted this! What an amazing talent!
