
1. How many ways can you make 10? Put dots different ways on the butterfly's wings.

Spelling Words

Sound Sorter

Get a selection of objects and ask your child to sort them into two groups - those that contain a c, k or ck sound and those that do not.

Your choice!

Pick a story to read together, any time you read a word that has a c. k or ck sound in it:

Point to it! Trace it in the air! Say it!

Make the posties route

Build the route that the Jolly Postman takes through the snow delivering all the letters, using construction blocks.

What does he see on the way? Who is lurking behind the trees?

Reread the story with your grownup, talk about what bits you liked and what bits you disliked.

What was your favourite stop on the posties route?

Try and act out the story using any props or costumes you have at home. Or make paper puppets! Have fun, try silly voices!

Memory Game

Pack a few items in a basket or tub, things that Red Riding Hood might take with her to grandma's house, such as an apple, a book, a pencil, a phone. Show your child the items and ask them to remember them all, then cover the items with a cloth. How many can they remember? For more challenge add more items! Or take one away, can your child work out which is gone... perhaps the Big Bad Wolf took it!
