Language and Literacy Reading



This term we will be reading the novel Wonder by R.J. Palacio. This novel includes many theme including empathy, friendship and kindness. We will use Active Literacy reading strategies to gain a deeper understanding of the text

Writing

In writing, the focus will be on functional writing. The children will cover a number of genres including reports and explanation texts. The focus will be on complex punctuation and sentence openers.

Listening and Talking

As part of our Scottish fortnight all children in Primary 7 will be expected to learn and recite a section of the Robert Burns poem Tam O'Shanter. The children will also be planning and delivering a Burns Breakfast where each child will take on a speaking role in front of an invited audience.

Numeracy

This term, we will extend our knowledge and skills across a wide range of numeracy concepts including percentages, grid references, algebraic thinking, money and speed, time and distance.

All topics covered in class are added to My Maths and Sumdog challenges are created to help the children revise these areas. Although homework tasks are optional practising numeracy and mathematical concepts can help to strengthen understanding.
