Outdoor Learning

The children are encouraged to access the outdoor play area every day and in all weathers. We ask that you provide a waterproof suit and welly boots if you can and we will store these in the children's individual boxes for easy access each day.

Sharing Children's Learning

Each child has a unique online learning journal and we aim to keep you updated with their learning within the centre through published stories, observations, videos and a regular slideshow. We really encourage parents to share the learning or events that happen at home or outwith the centre as this gives us great insight to your child's special interests and improves partnership working. This month we will be focusing on personal hygiene and, in particular, hand washing which I know you will all be promoting at home. Parental Engagement & Community Partnership

At Riccarton ECC, we aim to ensure we have excellent channels of communication with our parents. We work in close partnership with you all and external agencies to offer activities and experiences that will benefit all our children and their families.

There is a noticeboard located at each drop off outdoor area which is regularly updated with lunch time choices, news and events. We communicate regularly through our APP and Learning Journals, giving ideas of play experiences to try out at home. We will send out a newsletter at the beginning of every month so you can plan for events that are happening. Each week we celebrate the children's successes in the centre by having a "Star Of The Week".

Lorraine Skeoch is our Community Practitioner, her role is to provide support and advice on parenting – for example, routines in the home, behaviour management, fussy eating or toilet training. She will be available to talk outside the nursery (back gate) every Friday if you have a query or concern. She plans to host fun family sessions throughout the year such as Book Bug, Play at Home & Peer Massage. These sessions have always been popular in the past.

The staff will set smart targets for your child specific to their stage of development and their interests, they will discuss their thoughts with you at the Stay & Play sessions in order an agreement can be made on the best targets for your child within the areas of Health & Wellbeing, Literacy and Numeracy.

In order we can provide a wide range of activities and events, we have regular fundraising throughout the year. We need your help and are currently looking for parents to be part of an informal group to assist us in organising fundraising events.
