'Talk about it' means you have to give your opinion, meaning there is no right or wrong answer. Your answers should be written in full sentences - remembering your 4 core targets.

- 1. Find it What kind of fish was the Rainbow fish described as?
- 2. Find it Why were the other fish 'amazed' at Rainbow fish?
- 3. Prove it What does 'admire' mean?
- 4. Find it What does the starfish tell Rainbow fish to do?
- 5. Talk about it If you were Rainbow fish, would you take the wise octopus' advice and give some of your scales away to the other fish? Give a reason for your answer.
- 6. Prove it What does wise octopus mean when he says to Rainbow fish 'you will no longer be the most beautiful fish in the sea, but you will discover how to be happy'?

- 7. Find it What happened to Rainbow Fish when he started to give his scales away?
- 8. Talk about it How would you feel if you were like Rainbow fish and gave away your 'most prized possessions'? Give a reason for your answer.
