

JORDAN CRAMOND - PART OF THE GANG!



Stewarton school-boy Jordan Cramond found his passion and love of drama at age 4 – almost ten years later he landed his first major t.v. film role starring alongside David Walliams and Alan Davies in David Walliams’ screen adaptation of his children’s novel “The Midnight Gang”.

Jordan, age 14, who comes from Stewarton and lives with his parents Neil and Elaine and his 78 year - old Nana. Jordan is a pupil at Stewarton Academy and is currently in S3 – Mum Elaine said “Stewarton Academy staff and Head Teacher Katy Hegarty have been massively supportive of Jordan’s acting

career and during his four week shoot of The Midnight Gang liased with his on-set tutor to ensure Jordan didn’t fall behind in his studies.

Jordan who has Dyslexia has never let it get in the way of fulfilling his dreams of being an actor, if anything, his desire to learn the words on the scripts has actually proved a positive thing.



Jordan said “As an actor you go for lots of auditions and very often it’s a ‘No!’, but you learn quickly to handle this and when you land a role like The Midnight Gang you appreciate it all the more”. Jordan plays the character of George, an upbeat, funny Scottish boy who finds himself in hospital and becomes

part of a secret “gang”. He said working with David Walliams and Alan Davies and all the other well-known actors was a pleasure and a privilege – the film was shot in various locations throughout Glasgow, including Glasgow University.

Jordan said “I attend U.K. Theatre School in Glasgow where the staff and tutors are amazing – this will be my eighth year there, I have learned a lot from the advanced acting course and musical theatre but I’d always call myself an actor first and foremost who happens to be able to sing and dance a bit. One of the highlights was on the 16th December Jordan and his parents were flown to London to attend the private screening at B.F.I. to watch the Midnight Gang on the Big Screen. Mum Elaine said “His Dad and I could not have been prouder – it was a very surreal moment to see your wee boy on the big screen. The whole cast and crew of the midnight Gang were brilliant and we’ve all remained friends – I suspect the “gang” will be friends for life”.

Jordan added “I think in ten years they should make a sequel to The Midnight Gang so we can see how George, Amber, Tom, Sally and Robin all turned out..... so David Walliam’s, you better get writing”.
