All pupils should be picked up at the end of rehearsals from Kilmarnock Academy by 6:30pm

Each Music Department will be advised of pick-up times for rehearsals and concert as applicable.

PRE-CONCERT REHEARSAL: Tuesday **afternoon** 14th March in the Grand Hall, Kilmarnock (time to be confirmed).

SPRING CONCERT: Tuesday 14th March at 7:00pm in the Grand Hall, Kilmarnock.

Return transport to the rehearsals will be provided from Robert Burns Academy, Doon Academy and Loudoun Academy. If transport is required, please include this in the sign-up consent form. While Friday is often an early day for schools as the rehearsal starts at 3:30pm there should be sufficient time for pupils from Kilmarnock schools to make their own way to Kilmarnock Academy. Kilmarnock, Grange and St. Joseph's pupils will be required to arrange their own transport home after the rehearsals.

On the day of the concert, transport will be provided from **all** secondary schools to the Grand Hall. Return transport will only be provided to: Robert Burns, Doon, Loudoun and Stewarton Academies. There will be more details provided nearer to the time to ascertain transport numbers.

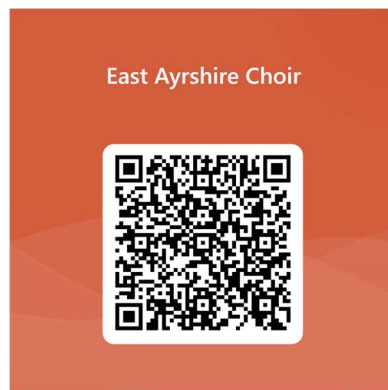
