2. Further Detail - Snapshot

S4 – S6 Awards Ceremony

Maths Week

The Maths department led a number of activities and competitions for all young people. Pupil leadership played a significant part in the success of the event. Some of our young people worked with our campus nursery staff to deliver lessons to toddlers. The Maths challenge in the assembly hall proved to be very popular.

S1 Mass of Welcome and S6 Caritas and Investiture Mass

We welcomed P7 pupils from our associated schools to a celebration of Mass. The pupils then worked in different departments to gain an insight into life at St. Joseph's. Formal plans for transition are ongoing with Mrs Hoy likely to begin transition meetings in December of this year.

Our investiture Mass for Caritas pupils and the school leadership team took place on Monday 17th September. Pupils were invited to sign up to participate in the parish life of our associated parish communities and were issued with their leadership badges. The Mass was a joyous occasion for the families gathered with us.

Duke of Edinburgh Expedition

Nine pupils and three staff ventured out to Renfrewshire over the weekend beginning Friday 14th September. Battling very adverse weather, the group survived a number of minor setbacks to complete the final expedition associated with the Silver award. A number of the group are considering taking on the challenge of a gold award next session.

Community Diversity Event

Lord McConnell visited the school on Wednesday 19th September to gather with representatives of the local community to celebrate the work of pupils from three local schools. A number of St. Joseph's pupils have been involved in New Farm Loch's diversity and anti-sectarianism programme and have worked with peers from Grange and Loudon. The work of the group will be showcased by a new free to air Scottish TV channel in the coming weeks.
