2. Further Detail - Snapshot

Second S3 Careers Event

Parents/Carers visited our S2 pupils during PSE to speak of their career path and what it takes to run or contribute to the running of a business. Another set of parents and partners met with our S3 cohort last week to share their experience of the world of work and to outline their own professional journey. Next week, S3 pupils will be interviewed by parents and partners as part of our ongoing engagement with developing the young workforce. I would like to thank Mrs Cassidy, Mrs Marshall and all parents and partners who contributed to the above events.

Please note, since the original entry shown above, our S3 pupils completed their interviews. Feedback from visiting staff was extremely positive. Mrs Marshall is meeting with staff from the chamber to plan next session's events across a range of year groups.

Whole School Mass

We were delighted to celebrate Mass on the feast day of our patron saint, St. Joseph. Our chaplains noted that participation is increasing and that respect shown during Mass is improving with each whole school Mass. Easter School

Sessions ran across four days in a range of subjects. Staff reported strong attendance in comparison to last session and pupils and parents commented on the increase in sessions on offer.

I-Pad rollout and ICT Service

All current S1 pupils are now in possession of their I-Pad. All current S6 must return their device before the school prom.

Our technician, Mr Campbell, has left to join St. Thomas Aquinas Secondary in Glasgow. His post is currently out to advert. Leavers' attainment meeting with Head of Education
