School Inspection

The final version of the letter to parents and carers and the school report are to be sent to the school tomorrow (Tuesday 26th November). Publication on the Education Scotland website should follow by mid-December.

The draft letter will be shown to the parent council this evening, and this includes grades. Members are asked to use discretion prior to publication, but the grades will not change between then and now. The letter and report highlight some strong practice and areas for improvement. The inspection result is broadly in line with the self-evaluated grades submitted by the school, and no revisit will take place in relation to the inspection.

Formal Launch of St. Joseph's Skills Academy and DYW S3 Careers Event

Our annual S3 careers event was well received by pupils and business partners. Despite a significant number of late call offs on the part of local businesses, the event ran smoothly, with feedback from young people extremely positive. One guest commented that the group were the most engaged and best behaved that they had worked with in over ten years visiting local schools.

Our skills academy programme was formally launched last week. This programme is funded via The Princes Trust and extends from S2 to S5 for some young people. The course allows for the development of work based skills within the curriculum.

4. Strategic Matters

Prelims

The annual prelim timetable will be shared with parents/carers and young people no later than Friday 30th November. The diet will run from Monday 6th January until Friday 24th January 2020. The timetable needs to be revised on an annual basis in light of conflicts which can exist between two different subjects for those young people sitting both papers. Additional Support arrangements are also in hand.

Revised internal tracking systems and mentoring programmes

Miss Quigley has issued standardised intervention guidance in line with our latest improvement plan. All department staff are now working against the same procedures for intervention and communication with families.

In addition, Miss Quigley has initiated a mentor scheme for those young people sitting four or more Highers in S5. Each pupil has a staff mentor with whom they can meet regularly. Miss Quigley will provide more detail at this evenings meeting.

Educational Psychologist Needs Analysis

Mark Brotherton is our current Educational Psychologist and has been with us since September. Mark has worked with Mr Boyle to conduct a needs analysis to support us in our assessment and referral systems. These systems are used when young people require additional intervention e.g. suspected ASN need, access to our PEF funded hub, input from educational psychologist, referral to CAMHS.

The needs analysis was completed last week and we have agreed upon four baseline assessments for use with young people prior to onward referral. This is a significant step against improvement plan priorities of the past two sessions. Further update to follow around forms of assessment at next PC meeting.
