Welcome and Opening Prayer

Mr Kane took us through the document stage by stage.

Points raised as we went through the document;

- As a result of government directive and given the model, there isn't a lot of time for preparations around on-line learning.
- Gradual introduction isn't a change to the original plan. This is simply to ensure the pupils get to know and understand the requirements around H&S, the restrictions which will be in place and to iron out any teething issues and subject choice changes impacting on timetable.
- S1 & S2 can't be in school on same day as there is insufficient staff
- If social distancing remains there may be a need to ratate S1 & S2 on Thursdays/ Fridays
- Question raised as to the possibility that Friday could be increased to a 7period day. This is not on the agenda.
- Question raised around potential for Schools to explore the use of community space and the provision of additional staff;
 - o St Matthews Church is a possibility, however, throws up additional challenges
 - Staff not a school decision, up to government to provide answers
- Transportation is a huge concern for Mr Kane.
- Should siblings need to attend school together, because there is no-one at home, but one of the siblings isn't due in school, on that particular day, then the school will make provision to accommodate them within the IT suite. However, no direct teaching will take place with the pupil who isn't due to attend.

Jim expressed his thanks to Mr Kane and all the teaching staff for all their efforts over the last few months. This sentiment was echoed by all Parents.
