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1) School Day

Monday – Thursday – 8.50am – 3.40pm – 7 x 50 minute periods, 15 minute interval, 45 minute lunch 45 minute lunch

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Monday to Thursday school buses leave at 3.45pm.

On Fridays, school buses leave at 2.00pm, however, from 1.15pm (the start of lunchtime) those who do not get a school bus have the option to have lunch in school or leave as there are no more classes. Those who do travel on the school bus may be picked up or make alternative travel arrangements if they do not want to wait until 2.00pm.





2) Transport

Free or subsidised school buses are provided (taxi in some cases) for those who qualify for this.

- Black Trousers or skirt (not black jeans, leggings or tracksuit bottoms)
- White Shirt
- School Tie
- School Blazer
- Black Shoes
- Outside jackets can be worn but must be removed inside the building

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Our uniform consists of;

A Black Blazer with school badge

A Black skirt or smart trousers (not leggings, jeans or tracksuit bottoms)


A White shirt (not polo shirt or a black shirt)

School tie – which should be visible at all times

A plain black jumper or cardigan (without logos, designs or any visible branding)

Plain black shoes (not those with coloured or white soles or patterns)

All outdoor jackets and coats (not including school blazer) must be removed on entering the school building

PE Kit at St Joseph's Academy

Below are the key messages on what is appropriate P.E. kit.

Short sleeved or long-sleeved T-Shirt (No vests, no crop tops, no football tops)

Shorts (appropriate length)

Tracksuit bottoms or jogging bottoms (No jeans or school trousers)

Sports leggings

Trainers (no school shoes, school boots)

Moulded shoes/boots for outdoor on astro if you have any.

Waterproof jacket and bottoms

Change of socks

Pupils must bring a change of kit (top, bottoms and footwear). When outdoors pupils are permitted wear outdoor jackets/hoodies.

Pupils must enter and leave the P.E. department in uniform (if you have P.E. period 1 you must still arrive in school wearing your school uniform)

Injured or unwell

From time to time pupils are injured or ill and are unable to take part in P.E. However, this **must** be supported by a signed parental note.

However, even if injured or ill, pupils must change and take part in the lesson in some capacity (setting up, scoring, refereeing, timing).

Forgetting Kit

Pupils are **expected** to bring full PE kit on each day they have P.E. If pupils forget kit, they are expected to borrow <u>clean</u>, <u>laundered kit</u> and return it at the end of the lesson.

Refusing to borrow kit will be dealt with seriously:

This will result in a referral to the Principal Teacher and parents/carers will be informed.

Forgetting P.E. kit again will result in a referral to your Year Head (DHT).





4) Curriculum

Pupils study the following subjects in S1:

Maths, English, R.E, Modern Languages (French, Spanish), Social Subjects (History, Geography, Modern Studies), Science (Biology, Physics, Chemistry), Technical, Art, Music, H.E, P.E, ICT, Pupil Support.

The groups in which they will attend subjects are as follows:

Register class (R) This will be your register class e.g. 1A1, 1M1 which will have up to 30 pupils in the class.

Practical class (P) This will be your practical class e.g. 1P1, 1P6 which will have up to 20 pupils in the class.

Set Classes (S) Classes are set depending on current working levels and pace of work. These can change.





5) Communication with Parents

Digital

Satchel 1:- Subject Teachers update this when homework has been issued. Parents download the app and can see any homework has been issued, buy which subjects, and the due date.

School App: Open the app store associated with your phone. Search for 'School App for Parents'. Download and install the app for free. Enter St. Joseph's Academy, Kilmarnock. Most messages show under the 'Messages' tab rather than news.

Letters

Any events trips or important information will usually be sent to parents by letter (often duplicated by email).

At times they may have permission slips attached.

Letters are also uploaded onto the school app.



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5) Communication with Parents

Phone/Texts

Texts are sent from the school to inform parents of unreported absence or truancy.

Principal Teachers, Pastoral Care or Year Heads may call regarding concerns or an incident.

All communication from/with school will go through your child's Pastoral Care teacher.

Contacting St. Joseph's

Calls to report absence should be made to the school office.

For parents/carers making contact with school regarding their child (other than sickness/absence), the initial point of contact for would be via their Pastoral Care teacher.

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6) Free School Meals

Application forms for free school meals must be submitted online. For those with no access to a computer, East Ayrshire Council are encouraging using computer facilities in local Libraries. As a last resort, parents can call and someone will complete the form over the phone for them.

Lunch system/ParentPay

We use a Biometric cashless system in St. Joseph's, where pupils have their thumb print taken and this is used to open their account when purchasing lunch. The ParentPay system used in most primary school is also used in St. Joseph's, where parents/carers credit their child's account with an appropriate amount of money. Under normal circumstances, pupils queue up and choose from the selection of food on a particular day. There is a queueing system in place

Mon – S1, S2, S3, S4/5/6 Tue – S2, S3, S4/5/6, S1 Wed – S3, S4/5/6, S1, S2 Thurs – S4/5/6, S1, S2, S3 Fri – First come first served (Fridays tend not be busy)

This system is not running the moment due to distancing measures and we are using an ordering system which requires parents to use a pre order portal. This may or may not be in use at the start of session 2021/22.
