Next term in Drama

- S1 pupils will learn the art of improvisation using a range of stimulus materials. Pupils will have the opportunity to create unscripted dramas using a range of styles.
- S2 pupils will work on developing drama skills and characterisation techniques. This will allow them to develop and expand the range of characters they play and encourage them to use more drama conventions. Pupils will work in small groups with a focus on sustaining characters throughout performance.
- S3 pupils will create their own drama in response to stimulus. They will continue to develop dramatic techniques and how to communicate ideas to a target audience, while investigating form & genre. Pupils will also have the opportunity to explore the use of theatre arts to enhance performance.
