# Parent Council – School Report Monday 20<sup>th</sup> November 2023

### 1. General Update

#### **Prelim Dates**

The prelim timetable was issued to individual pupils and via the school app.

Where young people have support arrangements in place for the prelim diet, Mrs Hoy either has or will meet with them to finalise accommodation arrangements and IT access.

## Parents' Evenings and Reporting

S2 Parents' Evening takes place tomorrow, Tuesday 21<sup>st</sup> November. Parents' Evenings have taken place for S3 and S5/6. S1 Parents' Evening takes place on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> December.

Turnout – S3 Parents' Evening – 53% Turnout – S5/6 Parents' Evening – 64.3%

The majority of S5/6 Parents/Carers and almost all S3 Parents/Carers reported preferring face to face events over online.

Feedback mainly centred on the layout of the hall, with a new layout and map now agreed and ready for distribution tomorrow evening at the S2 event. There were some comments around frustration caused by appointments not running to time. Overall, the feedback was positive in terms of the quality of conversation/information.

### **RSHP** Consultation

Mr Kane shared with all parents/carers communication encouraging them to engage with and respond to the live consultation on delivery of RSHP in Scottish schools. There are a number of potential outcomes that could impact delivery of elements of RSHP/RE in Catholic schools. Some of the potential outcomes are alarming in terms of how they may sit against the terms of the Education Act.
