Park School Consultation

Two events were held during November whereby interested parties, including parents/carers, could attend and ask questions of representatives of East Ayrshire Council, Grange Academy, Park School and St. Joseph's Academy.

Education Scotland are due to conduct site visits in January, and will want to speak to a small group of parents/carers. Details of their input will be confirmed in the New Year. The formal consultation period ended on 6th December 2024, and the Parent Council will be kept informed of any further developments once the final recommendations are shared with EAC Cabinet.

2. Staffing

Technical Teacher (Full Time)

We are still unable to attract any applicants for the post of Technical teacher. Previously communicated arrangements remain in place for S4 and S5 sections. S3 sections in Practical Woodworking were collapsed.

Given ongoing challenges, we are now unlikely to source a permanent staff member. We will continue to request that a temporary post be advertised up to the Easter break. Thereafter, consideration will be given as to whether or not it is viable to offer Technical during session 2025/26.

Teacher of Support for Learning

Mr Crawford has now moved on to a permanent post elsewhere. Interviews for this post are scheduled to take place during w/b Monday 16th December.

Classroom Assistant Vacancies

Unfortunately, we find ourselves in a cycle of appointing preferred candidates who then change their mind about taking the post after interview. We have two vacancies, and have asked for permission to advertise over Christmas and into the New Year.

AP Base

A preferred candidate has been identified for our AP Base provision. Pre-employment checks are ongoing. We hope the preferred candidate will be able to start in January 2025.
