# EAST AYRSHIRE COUNCIL (WHATRIGGS PRIMARY SCHOOL SURROUNDING STREETS, KILMARNOCK) (PARKING RESTRICTIONS) ORDER 2024

# Report

### **Background to the Proposal**

Whatriggs Primary School has experienced antisocial parking since its opening in 2017. Even though there are parking spaces on the school's property, there has been a noticeable rise in the amount of parking on the neighbouring streets especially during school hours, which has caused congestion, safety and access difficulties for local people.

## **Associated Strategies and Council Policy's**

East Ayrshire Council published its five-year strategic plan in March 2023. These parking restrictions would directly support two of the council's key initiatives, "Improving Community Wellbeing" & "Delivering a Clean Green East Ayrshire".

In particular we want to "Embed a place-based and multi-disciplinary approach to the planning and delivery of community wellbeing" by ensuring that Whattriggs Primary and surrounding streets do not face issues with antisocial parking we are making sure that our services are accessible to all.
