The number of pupils who have chosen the subject and the availability of teaching staff

- Five subjects must be selected plus one short course. These should be numbered 1 to 5 in order of preference.
 A reserve subject should also be selected. This should be marked R. If you are studying 2 or more Advanced Highers you may select 4 subjects in total.
- Not every subject is offered at each level. You should indicate the level you plan to study the subject at in S6.
 This should be done by ticking the correct level box next to your selected subject.
- 3. You should select one short course. This will be studied for one period per week. The course you are selected should be ticked in the short course table.
- 4. Some Advanced Highers may be offered in other schools in East Ayrshire. Should you choose to study an advanced higher subject at another school and you gain a place in a class you will be responsible for any transport arrangements and/or costs.
- 5. SWEIC Offer students in S6 can apply to undertake a range of Advanced Higher and Higher courses through their virtual learning campus. The subjects on offer this session have been confirmed as: Ad H History, Ad H English, H Politics, Ad H Maths, Ad H Graphic Communication. In addition to this, there will be a range of modern languages at N5 to Ad H level, including French, German, Italian & Spanish.
- 6. YASS (Young applicants in Schools Scheme) are modules offered by the Open University giving S6 students the chance to study a range of first year university level modules. They are geared towards highly academic students who expect to achieve 4 or 5 Highers with A or B passes in S5. Students may opt to study a YASS module in any column.
- 7. Ayrshire College offers a range of courses at their Ayr & Kilmarnock Campus, which our students can take advantage of. Please see the Ayrshire College website showing the courses on offer and entry requirements. These courses will run on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 2 4pm, pupils selecting a college option will not miss time from the other 4 subjects they have selected. A college application must be completed if you select this as a subject. If you do not gain a place on your selected college course you will need to select a further school subject to ensure you have a full timetable.
- 8. Pupils and parents/carers should use the Kilmarnock Academy Prospectus 2025/26 to help them decide which subjects should be chosen. A copy is available by scanning the QR Code (overleaf).
