SCQF FRAMEWORK – WHAT IS IT?



- This is the system across Scotland which makes sure all qualifications are rated against each other, from National 1 all the way up to University level, it also includes Foundation, Modern and Graduate apprenticeships
- Kilmarnock Academy offers a range of subjects available at different levels to meet the needs of all learners – typically these are National 3 to Advanced Higher

SCQF FRAMEWORK AT KILMARNOCK ACADEMY (LEVELS)



SCQF Level 3: These will usually be at National 3, there is no exam at this level.

SCQF Level 4: These will usually be at National 4, there is no exam at this level.

SCQF Level 5:

- National 5 (Graded A-D) – for example, English or History; these will usually have an external exam and an assignment that is completed under assessment conditions in class.
- Level 5 (Ungraded - pass or fail) – for example, Travel & Tourism and Health Sector; these will have no external exam.
- NPA Level 5 (Graded Pass or Fail) – for example Business with Information Technology; these will have no external exam.
- Foundation Apprenticeships – Hospitality; real life employment / business links.

SCQF FRAMEWORK AT KILMARNOCK ACADEMY (LEVELS)



SCQF Level 6:

- Higher (Graded A-D) – for example, Maths or Biology; these will usually have an external exams
- Level 6 (Ungraded - pass or fail only) – for example Creative Industries; these will have no external exam
- NPA Level 6 (Graded Pass or Fail) – for example Sports Leadership and Musical Theatre
- Foundation Apprenticeships – Early Education & Childcare and Business Skills

SCQF Level 7:

- Advanced Higher (Graded A-D) – for example, English or Music; these will usually have an external exam
- YASS – (Graded Pass or Fail) – online courses run by the Open University
- UWS Foundation Academy – Freestanding L7 unit supporting pupils university applications.

SCQF FRAMEWORK – KEY POINTS



Things to look out for:

Some courses are designed to build skills and experience for employment

Some courses are designed to build knowledge and skills for further study (post-school destinations)

Some courses have external exams at the end of the year, other courses are internally assessed throughout the year.

Each course has a notional time to complete (N5 240 – AH 320)

The higher the level of course, the greater the level of independent learning.

Look very carefully at College and University entry requirements as some courses only accept graded courses and some courses would rather have extra Highers rather than Advanced Highers







If you're still in school, you can do a Foundation apprenticeship in S5 or S6. You'll learn about the world of work and you'll come out with an industry recognised qualification.

MA

Modern Apprenticeships

You'll learn on the job in a Modern Apprenticeship. You'll just be like any other employee, but you'll also be working towards a qualification.

GA

Graduate Apprenticeships

Similar to a Modern Apprenticeship, you'll be an employee. But you'll be spending some of your time at university, working towards a degree and earning a wage at the same time.


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

- Courses start in June and finish at the end of April
- 2 afternoons per week (usually a Tuesday and Thursday)
2:00 – 4:00 or 2:00 – 5:00
- Attendance may be required during exam leave in May
- Travel to and from college is organised through school
- Attendance is reported weekly to school and parent/carer is contacted if attendance falls below a satisfactory percentage
- Progress is reported to school monthly and sent home to parent/carer in December & March

AYRSHIRE GROWTH DEAL – FOUNDATION APPRENTICESHIPS

A Foundation Apprenticeship gives young people the chance to combine work-based qualifications such as Scottish Vocational Qualifications (SVQs) or National Certificate (NC) with practical work experience in industry.

The course will be delivered in school and in a workplace environment. Work placements will be provided by the school.

This session the school will offer 3 new Foundation Apprenticeship opportunities:

- Business Skills SCQF Level 6
- Hospitality SCQF Level 5
- Social Services – Children and Young People (Early Education/Childcare) SCQF Level 6

These courses will be available for pupils in S5 and S6 only.

AYRSHIRE GROWTH DEAL – FOUNDATION APPRENTICESHIPS

Foundation Apprenticeship – Business Skills (SCQF Level 6 – 24 SCQF Points)

The course will focus on administration, management and leadership skills and covers key areas of this sector such as digital marketing, procurement, supply chain management, enterprise.

The following qualifications will be gained:

- National Progression Award (NPA) in Business Skills at SCQF Level 6
- Work Based Challenge Unit at SCQF Level 6
- Work Based Learning – SVQ in Business and Administration Level 6.

The pupils who should consider this are:

- Pupils who already have a background in Business and /or Admin and IT
- Pupils with an interest in a career in Business.



AYRSHIRE GROWTH DEAL – FOUNDATION APPRENTICESHIPS

Foundation Apprenticeship – Hospitality (SCQF Level 5 – 24 SCQF Points)

The course will focus on an introduction to the skills for a career in hospitality such as working in the professional kitchen, working front of house, industry skills and events.

The following qualifications will be gained:

- Skills for Work Hospitality at SCQF Level 5
- Work Based Challenge Unit at SCQF Level 5.

The pupils who should consider this are:

- Pupils with an interest in a career in any part of the Hospitality industry.
- Pupils who select this FA must also select Barista.



AYRSHIRE GROWTH DEAL – FOUNDATION APPRENTICESHIPS

Foundation Apprenticeship –Social Services – Children and Young People (Early Education/Childcare) (SCQF Level 6 – 24 SCQF Points)

The course will focus on an introduction to the skills for a career in early years/childcare such as how children develop, learn and play and key child protection protocols.

The following qualifications will be gained:

- National Progression Award (NPA) in Social Services (Children and Young People) at SCQF level 6
- Work Based Learning - SVQ in Social Services (Children and Young People) at SCQF level 6

The pupils who should consider this are:

- Pupils with an interest in a career in any part of the Early Years/Childcare indus



NEW COMMUNITY LINK COURSE – DANCE

DO YOU LOVE TO DANCE?

**WE'RE GIVING YOU A CHANCE TO GAIN A QUALIFICATION IN
SOMETHING YOU'RE ALREADY GOOD AT**

As of August 2026, Jam Street Dance will be offering courses in NPA level 4 dance for S4 pupils. National 5 dance for S4-S6 pupils and Higher dance for S5/S6 pupils.

This will run in line with the college courses. In S5/S6 this will be instead of one of your options. In S4 this will replace Core PE and PSE.

You must audition for a place on the course – please take an information letter with you if interested.



PREPARING FOR PROGRESSION

- It is really important at this point to consider where your future might be so you can opt for the correct subjects you will need for your chosen pathway.
- This is the time to start doing your research. Don't leave it too late as you might end up not having the subjects or qualifications you need.

WHAT SUBJECTS SHOULD I PICK – S4?

In S4 you must maximise your attainment, this means you should pick the subjects you are going to get the best qualifications in. This will give you the best chance of progression in S5 as you must continue with the subjects you picked in S4.

You must pick English and Maths then you should pick **5 other subjects** from those you are **currently studying in S3** (with a few exceptions). You should pick subjects in the following order:

- Those subjects which you are predicted to achieve a National 5.
- Those subjects you are good at
- Those subjects you enjoy

SCHOOL LEAVING AGE

- Turning 16 by or on 30th September – you can leave at the summer (end of S4)
- Turning 16 between 1st October and end of February, official school leaving date is December.
- However, you can get early release from school **IF** you get onto a full-time College course.

S5 EXPECTATIONS

This is the most important year in your school career. This is the year where you need to get your best possible qualifications.

- Study five Highers in S5 where possible, but no less than four, if you intend to accumulate enough Highers to meet entry requirements for University courses. You should study subjects to the highest level you possibly can.
- If wanting to pursue a career in law, medicine, dentistry, optometry or veterinary studies, you must attain five strong (often A grade) Highers in S5
- Commit the next year of your life to serious studying and familiarise yourself with the entry requirements for courses you are interested in
- Understand the increased demand of courses in S5 (often more than double the content of N5 courses)

WHAT SUBJECTS SHOULD I PICK – S5?

In S5 you must maximise your attainment by picking as many subjects at Higher as you can. This will give you the best chance of progression to your chosen pathway after school.

You should pick **5 subjects** from those you are **currently studying in S4** (with a few exceptions). You should pick subjects in the following order:

- Those subjects listed as entry requirements for the university or college course(s) of your choice (presuming you pass National 5 in S4 with an A or B). This will ensure you gain the best qualifications you can and have the best chance of success.
- Those subjects where you are predicted to attain an ‘A’ or a ‘B’ pass at National 5 level.
- Those subjects you are good at
- Those subjects you enjoy

SHOULD I PICK A SUBJECT IF I GET A ‘C’ AT NATIONAL 5?

Some subjects have better chance of progression from a C at National 5 than others. If you get a ‘C’ at National 5 in the following subjects there is a greater than 50% chance of passing Higher.

For other subjects the chances of passing at higher are much smaller and we would not recommend you pick these. You will be given advice about this during your options interview.
