**(a) the number of pupils who have chosen the subject  
(b) the availability of teaching staff**

1. Five subjects must be selected plus one short course. These should be numbered 1 to 5 in order of preference. A reserve subject should also be selected. This should be marked R. In S5 you should pick your best five subjects, this will ensure you have the best chance for entry to University, college or training. Your Pupil Support Teacher will help you with this
2. You should select one short course. This will be studied for one period per week. The course you are selected should be ticked in the short course table.
3. Ayrshire College offers a range of courses at their Kilmarnock Campus, which our students can take advantage of. Please see the Ayrshire College website showing the courses on offer and entry requirements. These courses will run on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons from 2 – 4pm, pupils selecting a college option will **not** miss time from the other 4 subjects they have selected in order to combine study at college. A college application must be completed if you select this as a subject. If you do not gain a place on your selected college course you will need to select a further school subject to ensure you have a full timetable.
4. Entry to Higher level normally requires a National 5 (A or B), for some subjects progression from a C is possible, your Pupil Support Teacher will let you know which subjects it is possible to progress to Higher with a 'C' at National 5. Check the Kilmarnock Academy Prospectus for the entry requirements of each course.
5. Pupils and parents/carers should use the Kilmarnock Academy Prospectus 2026 to help them decide which subjects should be chosen. A copy is available by scanning the QR Code (overleaf).
6. Parents/carers are asked to sign off the form and return to the Pupil Support Teacher no later than **Friday 30<sup>th</sup> January 2026**
