'Keep the Red Zone Clear' Event

It is part of our job as Junior Road Safety Officers to help make sure that all of the children and staff travel to and from Carolside Primary safely every day. The teachers, the Parent Council, people who live near the school, East Renfrewshire Council and the local Police are helping us to plan an event that will remind everyone about healthy ways to travel to school and to keep everyone safe.

It will improve air quality around the school and we have equipment monitoring the air quality levels being installed soon. It's Fit and Fruity Friday that day too and we are going to have a pedometer challenge for some of the older children.
