# 2. Chair's Report

# Playground group

It was discussed how to raise additional funding for the next stage of the playground development, this will be discussed in further detail at the next PSA meeting.

# **National Parent Forum (NPF)- Focus Group**

The chair encouraged any parent council members to attend the proposed focus group on Tuesday 16<sup>TH</sup> January. The purpose of this session is to get a view on the proposed consultation from parents.

#### **NPF Child Poverty Action Group- Equalities Forum**

The chair encouraged any parent council members to attend the proposed Equalities Forum on Thursday 18th January. The purpose of this session is to review a new toolkit on "the cost of the school day" produced by the NPF/Scottish child poverty action group to look at how we can evaluate / identify / deal with any particular barriers affecting children from disadvantaged backgrounds in the way schools operate.

# 3. Outdoor Centres for P7 Trip

In a bid to ensure best value for the P7 trip, a procurement exercise is underway, to review the 4 potential centres available.

In addition to the Lockerbie Centre, which has been the centre of choice for a number of years, 3 new centres are being assessed against various criteria, such as activity range.

### 6. Road safety

#### 7. Achievements and successes

It was agreed the Christmas Fayre was a great success, raising over £6k. The use of the school corridors and break out areas was also commended.

The Pebble Garden has not only been a great fundraiser but also has greatly improved the aesthetics of the Chestnut Garden.

The staff were praised for the work that went into the p1-3 nativities.

The Rocket Fund for STEM target was at 57% with a remaining 2 days to go, not a week as was previously thought. Members discussed that if the target was met, this would be a great cash injection for much needed equipment for the STEM room.

#### 8. AOCB

Claire Bowes raised that there was no Christmas programme for the upper school this year (2017). It was discussed the p6 children would be performing in the Cantata later in the year and the 2018 Christmas programme would be considered at a later date.

The muddiness of the junior playground was raised. It was agreed it can be dangerously slippy due to mulchy leaves and cannot be tackled by Mr. Daly alone. Last term a cleaner was hired. There is an action to contact the council regarding this.

Anne-Marie O'Brien has requested there is more consistency across classes in the same year, with specific reference to the "take home bear" in a primary 2 class. It was agreed Clare Duns will address this in the p2 teachers meeting. Gerard Devenney highlighted how Catholic education in Eastwood is prospering, citing St Ninians as one of the top performing schools in Scotland.
