We did:


- Regular Tweets with photographs of children's daily routine and work.
 Report card written by the children. Website refreshed with parental links
 and guidance. GLOW Profiles used in P6 and P7, these will be rolled out to
 whole school by June 2019. Report cards reviewed in consultation with
 parents to identify ways in which parents can support the next steps
 outlined for their child.
- Increase in after school clubs offered to all stages. Dodge ball, archery, football, fitness, street dance and gymnastics were just some of the clubs on offer. Code Club was also available for upper school children and 'Sacred space', chess and games clubs were offered during lunch.
- 3. Additional staff training for Outdoor Learning. 'Come and see my learning' events based on outdoor learning. Development of skills tracker for outdoor learning to ensure progression. 'Wild Week' whole school focus week on outdoor learning and physical activity. Introduction of the Daily Mile and resurfacing of Multi Use Games Area to increase opportunities for physical activity and sport.


This session, 2018-19, there were 3 main themes that emerged from your responses and our next steps are:


- 1. We will continue to develop our communication and provide regular opportunities for parents to discuss issues or concerns. Ensuring we are an approachable and available presence in and around the school.

- 3. We will ensure a broad and balanced curriculum. Providing experiences and opportunities to develop a wide range of skills and support the development of the whole child.





























































General comments from Parents
