The biggest challenge to Geographers is finishing the paper in time.

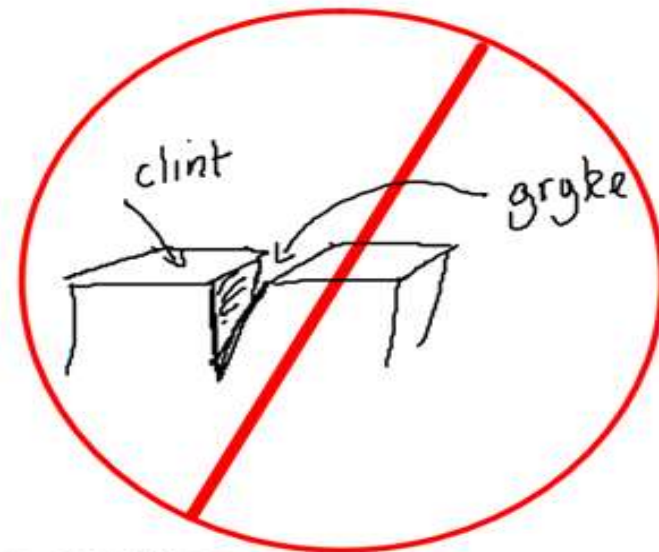
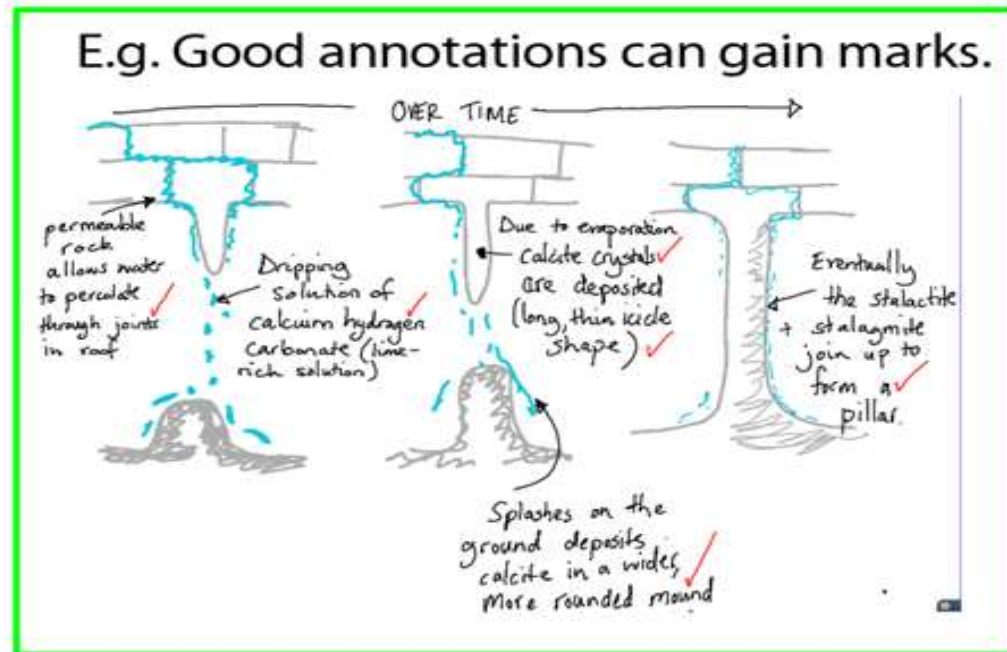
Pupils should practice timed answers at home to see how well they are progressing with their skills.
