message to everyone associated with the school for the


coming year.

# **MVP Ambassadors**

In September our S4 volunteers undertook their training as part of the Mentors in Violence Prevention programme.

gramme that gives young people the chance to explore and challenge the attitudes, beliefs and cultural norms that underpin gender-based violence, bullying and other forms of violence. It addresses a range of behaviours including name-calling, sexting, controlling behaviour and harassment, and uses a 'by-stander' approach

where individuals are not looked on as potential victims or perpetrators but as empowered and active bystanders with the ability to support and challenge their peers in a safe way.






awareness week to raise money for the Beatson Cancer Charity and held a staff v S6 softball match and a 'beat the goalie' event too.
