Placements can be for as little as 8 weeks or as much as 12 months and anything in between. Our short term placements aim to give an introduction into the retail environment and the basics of customer service. As part of our 6-12 month placements, you will have the opportunity to complete an ASDAN qualification in Employability, increasing your chance of employment in the future.

Land and Environmental Services (LES) is a council department which includes Parks, Cleansing, Roads and Scientific Services providing a range of services to the citizens within Glasgow. It has responsibility for maintaining parks and open spaces, roads, lighting as well as ensuring a clean environment within the city. LES offers a number of Modern Apprenticeships in these areas to include Environmental Apprenticeships, Roads Apprenticeships and Technical Apprenticeships.

GLASGOW GUARANTEE

Glasgow Guarantee offers apprenticeships for young people who attend a Glasgow school or live in a Glasgow postcode. An apprenticeship is a job with training. Being an apprentice means that you have a job that includes gaining recognised qualifications and essential skills whilst you are working and earning a wage.

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Glasgow Disability Alliance

POST SCHOOL BUSINESS PARTNER

Glasgow Disability Alliance is an organisation run by disabled people, for disabled people. We offer free, fully accessible learning for disabled people of all ages and with any type of impairment. Our learning is a mixture of fun taster sessions and longer programmes, including employability support programmes. As well as learning we offer 1-2-1 coaching plus opportunities to get involved and have your voice heard. GDA offers information and support around services and other organisations that support disabled people, including for example, self-directed support.

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Glasgow Health and Social Care Partnership

POST SCHOOL BUSINESS PARTNER

Glasgow City Council Supported Employment Service works with people who have a learning disability and/or autism to help them get and keep a full time job. Job coaches work on a 1:1 basis with individuals meeting them on a weekly basis to get to know them; their skills; abilities and aspirations before looking at employment. The approach is person centred and focussed solely on getting a full time job (over 16 hours/week). Job coaches provide a lot of support when someone starts work, often going to work with them and teaching them the tasks they need to learn to do their job successfully. A job coach supporting someone at work is not a permanent arrangement as support reduces over time. The service also delivers Project Search with our college partners.

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ENABLE Scotland

POST SCHOOL BUSINESS PARTNER

Delivers the following employability programmes in the Glasgow area.
Stepping Up: is our transitions programme based within Glasgow schools where we support pupils to gain the skills to find and maintain employment. We also support pupils to achieve practical work experience as well as supporting them through and employment specific qualification.
ESF First Steps: ENABLE Scotland's ESF funded programme 'First Steps' helps young people furthest from employment to begin to remove barriers.
Stage 2 and 3 EF: Our Employability Fund programme is well established in the Glasgow area. Stage 2 works on removing barriers to employment while building the skills and experience needed to find and maintain positive employment.
Stage 3 of Employability Fund focuses on gaining meaningful practical work experience alongside developing their employability skills.

**ROYAL STRATHCLYDE BLINDCRAFT INDUSTRIES (RSBi)
Manufacturing division of City Building**

Royal Strathclyde Blindcraft Industries (RSBi) is the manufacturing division of City Building who specialise in manufacturing a wide range of furniture products. RSBi is a supported factory who are committed to providing opportunities for people with disabilities.

The main emphasis of the programme is on providing a one year training course for students aged 15 to 17 years. Students follow this option for one half-day per week over the academic year and all delivery takes place in a workshop environment. Students gain genuine work experience alongside an educational qualification in the form of two units from the SVQ Performing Manufacturing Operations.

Students who have an aptitude for this type of work may be selected to come back for a second year to gain the full SVQ qualification.

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**Introduction to
Food Service Skills**

This two year course will develop a range of employability skills for the Hospitality Industry; to include food and drink service skills, food hygiene knowledge and practice alongside building confidence and team working skills and an awareness of the size and opportunities for employment within the Hospitality Industry.

Professional Cookery**

CITY OF GLASGOW COLLEGE

The course is designed to introduce students to prepare, cook and serve food. Students will be shown how to grate, slice, dice, chop, peel, blend, cream, beat, knead and produce a range of sweet and savoury dishes. Students will also be given an introduction into a range of cookery processes and develop an understanding of how to poach, boil, bake, steam and roast foods to create different dishes. All activities will be carried out in purpose built professional kitchens and students will be expected to comply fully with all Health and Safety Legislation and Food Hygiene Legislation.
