Treasurer's Report

There is currently £1,426.40 in the bank account. £69 of this is designated to Young Persons Services. An additional £30 has been raised by the Parent Council, so the final figure is £1,456.40. Departments are being asked to make a wish list for what they want to buy to spend some of the money.

School Report

- Before Christmas the 1st years went to see a play of A Christmas Carol
- Christmas jumper day was successful, over $\frac{1}{2}$ a ton was donated to the food bank. The biggest donation the school has given
- The Christmas dances for 1st and 2nd, 5th and 6th year went well
- This Christmas the school service was held in the school (in the big gym hall) due to bad weather conditions. We also had a performance from an up and coming band called Kardo.
- The Christmas merit reward was a trip to the cinema, over 400 pupils went. The staff in Cineworld were pleased with the behaviour of the pupils
- The school panto was successful and everyone who attended enjoyed it, the schools talent was on show
- 4th year prelims have all been marked and the majority of people will have got their results back. A report of everyone's results is being sent out so parents can see what their child got
- The IT department have got 2 new staff members: Tina Oman (new Tech teacher) and Colin Lamont who will start on 4th February (new Computing teacher)
- The council are looking to cut technicians jobs to save £160,000. There are going to be 2 technicians for the whole of East Renfrewshire starting this August
- The school review team with 17 members looked at the school and teaching to see where quality needed improving. The report consisted of 8 focus groups of pupils and 6 of staff, which helped finalise the report

Achievement

- The feedback from all the surveys has been reviewed and the result is 3 different achievement certificates: Excellence, Achievement and Honour.
- Pupils in 1st year will be completing the Sports Achievement award, where pupils in the past completed the John Muir award, this will give every pupil the opportunity to achieve at least one award.
- We will now give out SQA awards based on SQA points, for N5 pupils need to have 7 or more passes to get an award and for higher pupils need 3 Highers at a C to get an award.
