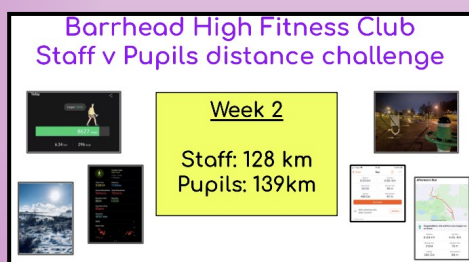
- S1 & S2 rotations will take place in some subjects this week. Please make sure you are in all your google classrooms and that you know what classes you have each day.

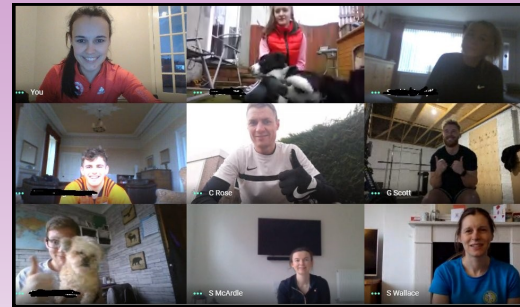
S3 English

Predicting the future

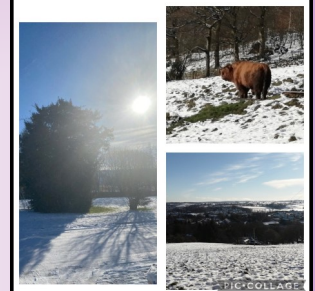

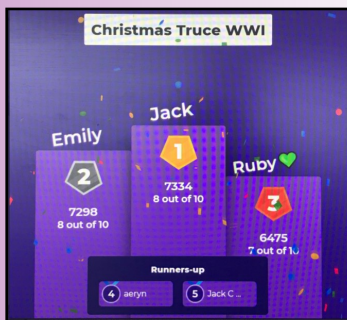

Weird day today but first things first merry christmas. Like i said today was a weird day. It started of normal like it has every other day you wake up get dressed, go to your position, get food and then do your jobs. I was on the front line next to the commander i was talking to him. It was still dark at the time and then we heard sing but not just any sing it was silent night but in german. As the song went along we started to join in when the song ended there was a long silence and the movement from the german trench. One of there men came out and said "we want a truce just for today send one of you soldiers out and we can talk i am unarmed" so one of our soldiers went out. Nothing happens and then simultaneously all soldiers from both sides started to show up and we started playing football and men who worked as barbers where giving us a good shave. It stopped evenchully and then we got sent a note and chocolate from the King.

Dear Mother,
I am devastated that I cannot be at home with you this Christmas, not being able to come home made me believe that the Christmas Day wouldn't be any different than any other day but that was so far from true!
Last night (Christmas Eve) all was silent in both sides of the trenches when we heard the Germans were singing Christmas carols, one by one we all joined in and sang lat into the night. We thought that would be the end of the Christmas cheer but early the next morning, the Germans shouted that they wanted a truce, just for the day. They sent one of their men out very slowly and one by one everyone came out of their trenches on both sides. All day long we forgot about the war and it felt like all was normal again, we shared cigars, sang songs and even played football with the Germans! It was incredibly strange but an enjoyable experience nonetheless. It will never make up for not being home to see you, but my spirits are now high that if we can hold a truce for a day we can make peace properly and end this war.

Dear Father
Yesterday night at about 02:00 am I was up with my stomach churning as I was extremely nervous for the 25th because it was my first proper day at war after months of training I still did not feel at all ready. I woke up and it was definitely the most miserable Christmas ever that I was about to have. I got up had my disgusting breakfast which consisted of a coffee and meat in a can. Out of absolutely nowhere the Germans started singing Christmas carols and then they were trying to make peace with us for Christmas day except no one was going forward so I decided to go forward and make peace and then everyone else came and we made peace. It was really eye opening to the fact that the German soldiers are the same as us and don't want to be here killing people. I always thought just to think of the German soldiers as horrible men that are against everything we believe in but at the end of the day we all bleed the same colour. Our Christmas festivities were brought to a close by the headquarters who ordered us to stay in our trenches unless ordered. I think we were worried we would all get too attached to each other and not fight.
