

Early Life & Beatles

John Winston Lennon was born on October 9, 1940, in Liverpool, Merseyside, England. His mother died in World War II. When he was four, his parents divorced, and he ended up separated, as he ended up living with his Aunt Mimi. Lennon's father was a merchant seaman.

July 6, 1957 was the day Paul McCartney and John Lennon became best friends. They both attended St. Peter's Church in Liverpool. They all formed completely separately.



Assassination

- Lennon was shot in 1980 in New York City outside his home, The Dakota Building.
- He was killed by a crazy fan that shot him 6 times.
- He was dead on arrival.




What was the Assassin trying to achieve

The day of the assassination

- He was assassinated on the 8th December 1980.
- Photographer Annie Leibovitz went to Lennon's apartment to do a photo shoot for Rolling Stone magazine.
- After the photo shoot Lennon gave what would be his last ever interview to San Francisco radio station KGO.
- They were approached by several people seeking autographs, among them a man called Mark Chapman.
- Mark Chapman silently handed Lennon a copy of one of his albums and Lennon signed it.




Why he could be targeted






