What do we expect?

Parents can support us by ensuring that your son/daughter is wearing:

- Black smart trousers
- Black skirts or tartan kilts
- White School shirt
- Black v-neck jumper/cardigan (**no logos**)
- Black shoes (**all black**)
- S1—S4 junior striped tie
- S1—S5 school blazer with badge
- S5—6 senior purple tie
- S6 optional-school blazer with badge & braiding
- Purple—polo shirt/t-shirt with school badge for PE



What's not acceptable?

As we are preparing our young people for the World of Work, **parents can support us by ensuring pupils do NOT wear the following items of clothing:**

- leggings, jeggings, shorts
- jeans (including black)
- short skirts
- hooded tops (any colour, including black)
- shirts which do not button at the neck
- white or coloured trainers,
- items with logos
- football colours
