## Revision clock for class or at home

Example- Social Subjects (A blank revision clock has been attached)

A revision clock with editable text boxes also attached

- Split your paper into 12 segments, like a clock face.
- Write down the different questions or subtopics that you can be asked about as part of this unit of work. (No need to prepare these, students can add to the blank clock face)
- Task: Take two colours of pens. Using your first pen, spend 4 minutes (or any time you wish) completing each segment of your clock from memory.
- This makes a good, quick, rigorous single period.
- Check your notes and then take your second colour of pen. Add in any additional information you missed first time round.
- You could also combine this activity with images like the dual coding example.
- This is useful for young people to maintain their focus at home by setting phone timers. Lessons go very quickly using this.
