ENGLISH

English is all about reading, writing, talking and listening. In the English Faculty we look at how we can help you develop each of these skills to become a confident adult ready to take on the world.

In term one, you will choose a novel to study and you will start your personal reading journey with help and support from our Librarian in the Library lessons. And you will learn how to PEE...

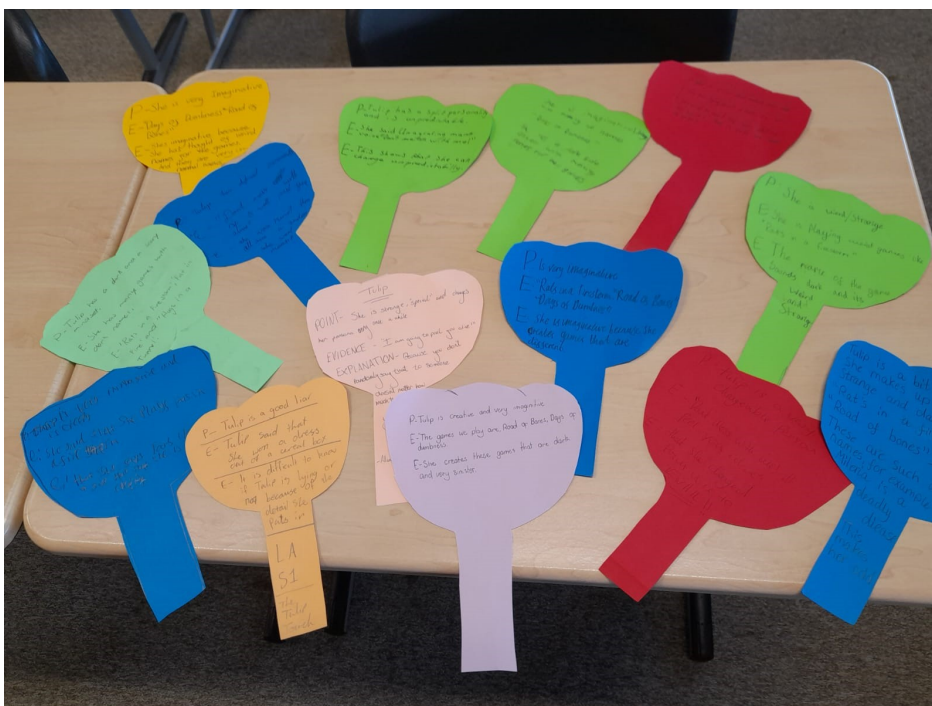


In term two, you will have the chance to complete some independent research and be given the opportunity to shine through your solo talk presentations.

In term three, you create persuasive posters and start to study poetry. This term also has a range of reading challenges. Be prepared for the competition...

In term four, you focus in on media and drama – reading films and acting out scenes.

There is weekly homework from August onwards and you will be part of a google classroom.



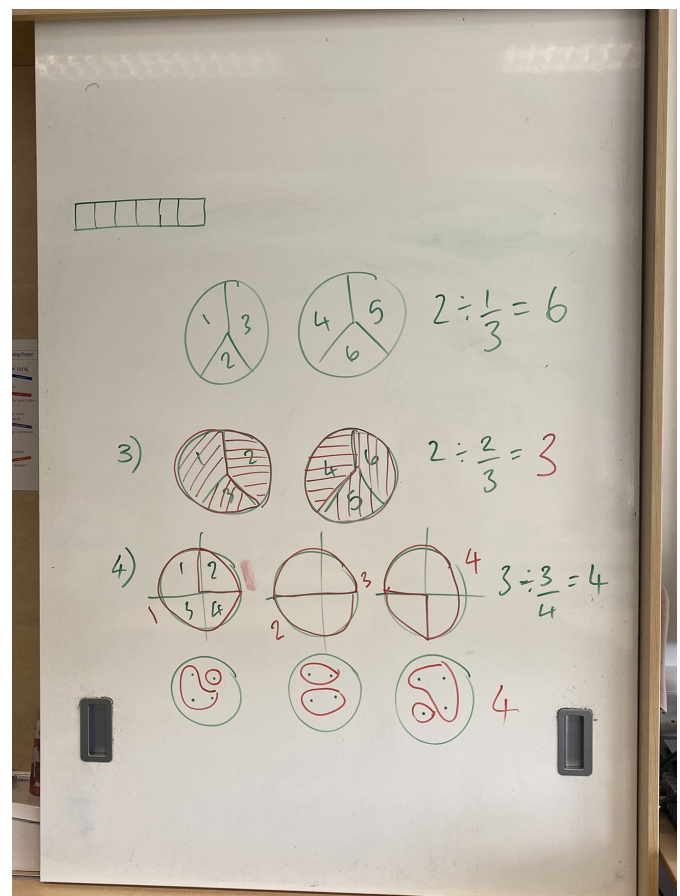
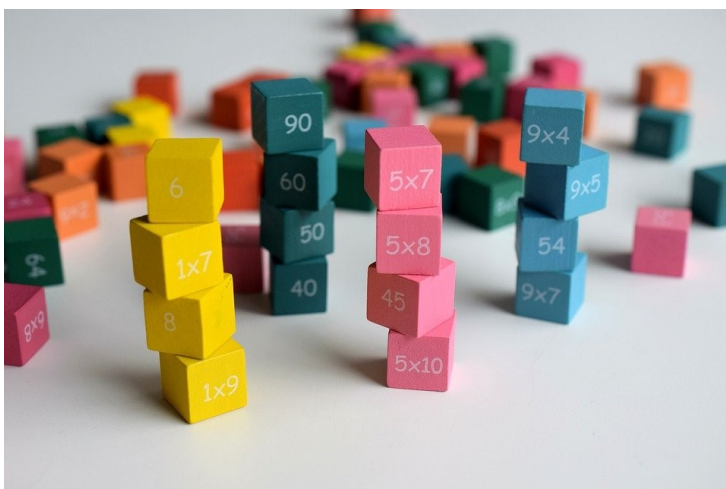

MATHEMATICS

In Mathematics, young people will meet a range of experiences and outcomes covering three main areas: Number, Money and Measure; Shape, Position and Movement and Information Handling. Throughout S1, learners will be given the opportunity to demonstrate their mental maths and problem solving capabilities, explore non-calculator and calculator work, make use of a variety of online learning resources and take part in monthly maths puzzles and maths competitions.

In S1, some of the topics covered are:

- Four Operations
- Negative Numbers
- Special Numbers
- Rounding
- Data Analysis and Probability
- Fractions, Decimals and Percentages
- Algebra
- Angles
- Symmetry
- Coordinates



Subject overviews

SCIENCE FACULTY

During S1 all learners follow a general Science course which includes elements from Biology, Chemistry and Physics.

Processes of the Planet

This topic looks at the properties of matter, solids, liquids and gases and how this is linked to global warming. This is Chemistry and Physics.

Electricity

We investigate electrical charges and how this creates both static electricity and a current. Learners use the Van De Graf generator to demonstrate static electricity. We investigate what effects current by building circuits. We also look at other ways of creating a current e.g. using fruit. This is Physics.

Body Systems

This topic looks at the basic structures of animal and plants. We begin by determining the differences between animal and plant cells using microscopes. Learners then look at the various stages between cells and the organs of a human body. The heart is looked at in detail by carrying out a heart dissection. This is Biology.



Properties and Uses of Substances

In this topic we take a look at the periodic table and the differences between elements and compounds. We investigate how a compound can be formed and look at the possibility of breaking the compound down again. The uses of some compounds are investigated. This is Chemistry.

All the topics are very practical with a number of interesting experiments carried out by

HEALTH AND FITNESS

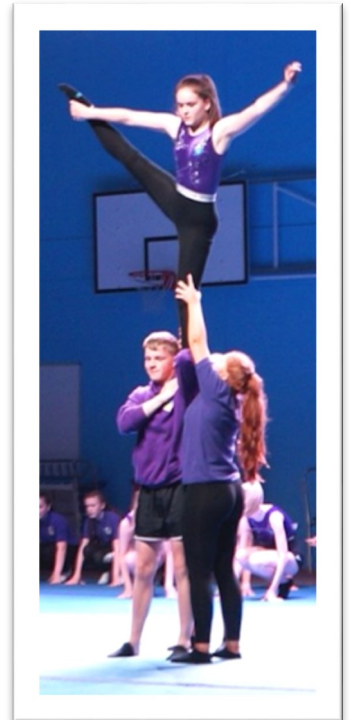
PHYSICAL EDUCATION

In Physical Education, pupils are encouraged to participate to the best of their ability in all activities and should bring a change of kit for every lesson.

The PE department consists of a large games hall, a small gym, a dance studio, 2 floodlit astroturf pitches and a 4 lane athletics track.

All classes follow a core programme of activities in S1, including: athletics; badminton; basketball; cycling; fitness; gymnastics; social dance; sports leader; summer games and trampolining.

During the block of sports leader, pupils will have the opportunity to lead learning and there is an element of choice at this time.

SOCIAL SUBJECTS

Geography is where we learn about the world around us – how do people and the environment interact.

In S1 you will learn about:

Empty Lands – we learn about the extreme climates around the world; rainforests, hot deserts and tundra lands. We also learn about threats to these places including deforestation and climate change.

Development – we learn about how life is different around the world, and why this is the case. We also learn about the Children's Rights Charter and Sustainable Development Goals and how these can improve life in lower-income countries.



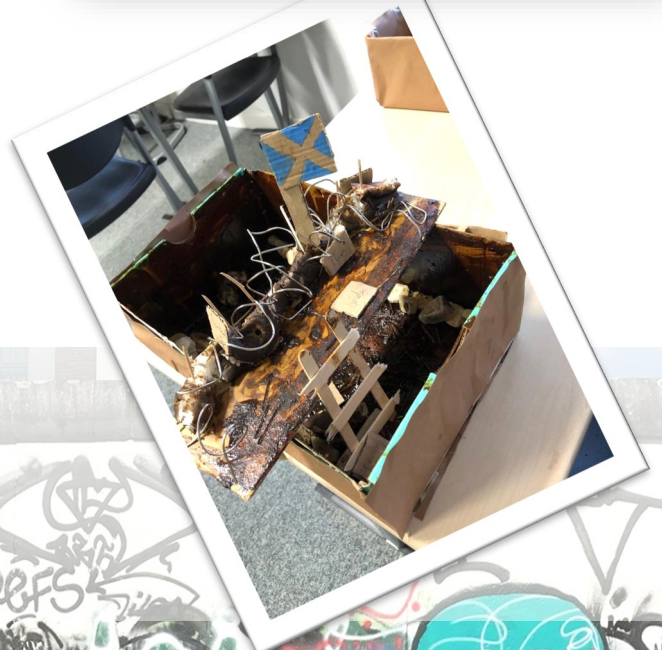

SOCIAL SUBJECTS

In **History**, you will learn a range of skills to help you investigate the past. You will work with historical sources to explore the causes and consequences of significant World events.

In S1 you will learn the skills you will use in history. You will also learn about different types of government including Democracy and Dictatorship. We also look at the factors surrounding the sinking of the Titanic.

We also learn about the causes of World War 1, and the impacts it had on Scotland and the rest of the World.



Subject overviews

SOCIAL SUBJECTS

Religious and Moral Education is where we examine some of the 'big questions' in life and think about your beliefs as well as those of others. We also look at RME in our community: from religious buildings to our local war memorial.

In S1 you study:

Introduction to Morality – we then look at different approaches to morality including religious and non-religious views. We also get a chance to develop our own morality.



Buddhism – this is the world religion we study in S1. We have a chance to look at the stories of Buddhism and why Buddhists do certain things.

Animal Rights – this is where we look at how humans treat animals. This also builds on our morality topic where we get to see how our morality impacts our view on animals. At the end of this unit, we complete a project on an issue of Animal Rights alongside the Design and Technology Department.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS

Art and Design

The S1 Art and Design course focuses on developing knowledge of the seven key visual elements, tone, line, form, shape, colour, texture and pattern. We explore many different materials, techniques and processes as well as learn about a diverse range of artists and designers.



You will learn to draw a sock, successfully by applying detail which shows scale and proportion this will be a test of your drawing skills.

Unit 1- Wallpaper Design

You will study the work of Glasgow textile designers 'Timorous Beasties' where you will become familiar with the design process of investigation, development and making a final piece. You will be introduced to observational drawing, simplifying and developing ideas and producing a mono printed final design. This design can then be digitally placed on many products.



Unit 2 – Landscape

This expressive unit looks at artists such as Vincent Van Gogh and David Hockney. We start with outdoor learning where we make our own paint brushes and use these to create landscape paintings. We will also create a collage and your work will be packed full of texture and colour.

Unit 3 - Graphic Design

You will work through a design process to create the branding for a healthy juice label. You will then investigate market research and develop a logo which incorporates image and text. The end product is to create a successful final logo which can be applied to carton, can or bottle.

EXPRESSIVE ARTS

Within the **Music** Department, you will gain an opportunity to try a variety of different instruments and listening activities to help you build musical skills. You will also learn how to improve your music literacy and participate in trips to see live performances where possible.

You may already play an instrument or wish to begin and in S1 we will develop further on what you have already done in Music either in Primary School or in your own time and help you to learn new skills with confidence.

Within the course, you will undertake a mixture of performing, inventing, and listening activities on your own and in groups. We find out about the Instruments of the Orchestra, Music across the World as well as giving you an opportunity to play the keyboard, glockenspiel, ukulele, djembe drums, and drum kit.

It is our aim is to engage and inspire learners to develop a love of music and develop their talent as musicians, and so increase self-confidence, creativity, and sense of achievement across our school and the community.



Subject overviews

EXPRESSIVE ARTS

Drama in S1 is where you will learn about how to take part in a theatrical stage presentation. You will learn about acting and how to create a character. You will also learn about the extra skills needed for the theatre such as props, costume, set design, and using sound and lights onstage. In S1 we focus on the skills of creating a drama, presenting it to an audience and evaluating the presentations we take part in and watch.

In S1 you study:

Stagecraft and Improvisation – as your introduction to Drama you will be taught about how to use the stage space when acting and how to be aware of the audience when you are acting. You will then part in different improvisations acting out a variety of characters.

Murder Mystery – this unit involves you becoming suspects, journalists, police officers and lawyers trying to solve a murder. The main skill developed in this unit is creating a character. You will follow the case by creating improvisations, finishing with a court case!

Script unit –

this is where we use short scripts to rehearse and act out. You will also decide on the costume and props needed for the presentation, find these and use them onstage.

MODERN LANGUAGES

You will continue learning **French** in S1.

We will cover these topics:

Family and Friends – we will learn to talk about our family members and our friends giving information about their physical appearance and their personality. We will also learn to say how we get on with different people.



School - We will learn to talk about Barrhead High School, talk about and give opinions about our school subjects, talk about the school day and the school canteen and learn about schools in other French-speaking countries.

Hobbies and Free-time – We will learn to talk about our hobbies and interests and learn vocabulary to talk about a wide range of sports activities, types of music and use of your phones, laptops and other devices.

MODERN LANGUAGES

You will continue learning **Mandarin** in S1.



We will cover these topics:

Chinese characters – We will begin by learning how to read and write Mandarin by imagining characters as pictures. From there we will move on to more complicated characters made by building up collections of these simpler picture-like characters. This process of character building will help you to learn and remember many more characters.

All about me – We will continue to learn more about how to talk about ourselves. The topics we will cover in this area will include how to talk about our age, Chinese zodiac signs and how to talk about our family members.

Festivals – We will learn all about the Mid-autumn Festival and the Spring Festival which are both very important to Chinese culture and society. We will look at the clothes, food and rituals associated with each festival and will learn some Chinese characters to help talk about the festival with others.

BUSINESS, ADMINISTRATION & COMPUTING SCIENCE

S1 BACS Course Outline

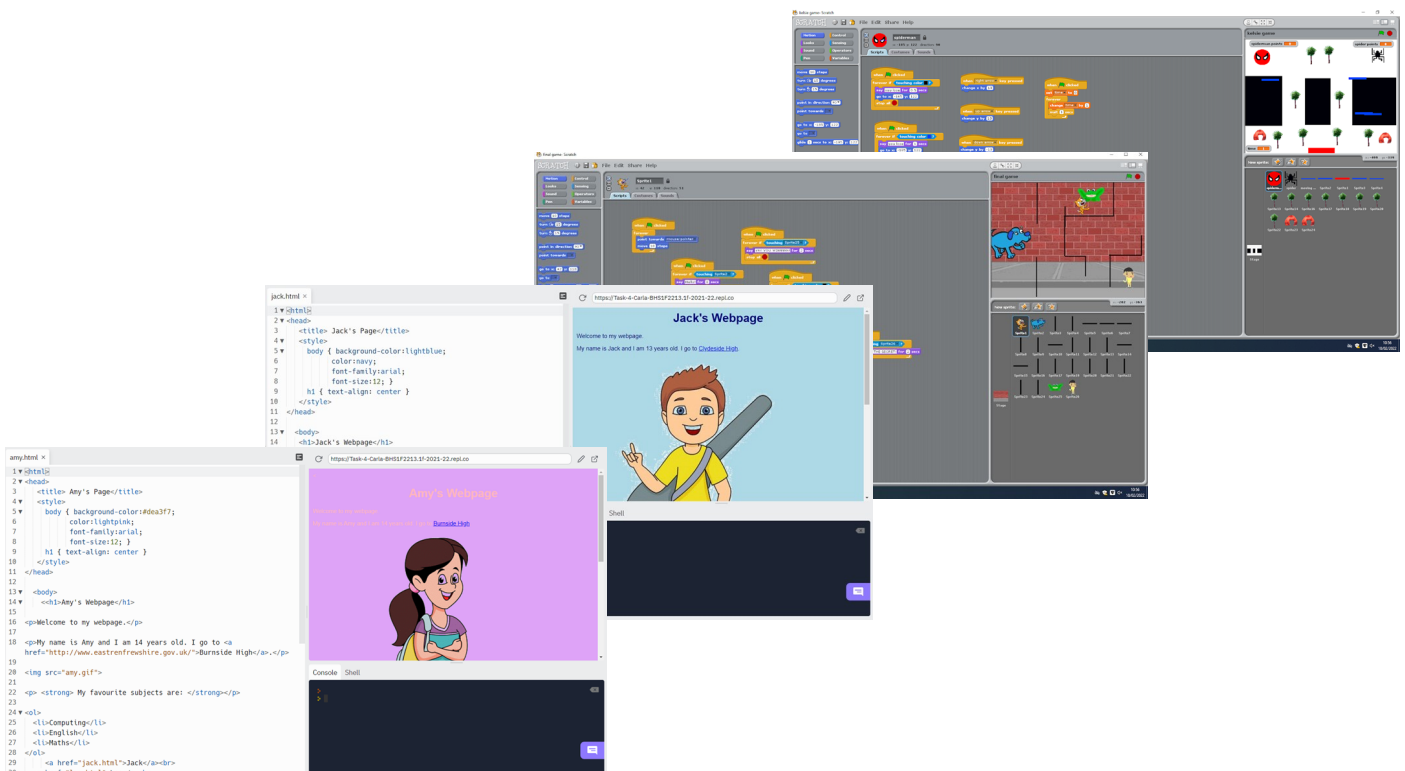
In S1 Students will follow a combined course covering topics from Business, Administration and Computing Science.

Pupils will develop their Administration and IT skills when working on the word-processing, spreadsheets and databases topics. They will learn how to the Microsoft Office package and features to create letters posters, charts and reports.

Pupils will also complete the Introduction to Business topic where they will learn to identify “Needs and Wants”, “Goods and Service” and the variety of payment methods available to customers to pay for their goods and services.

Pupils will develop their Computing Science skills and knowledge in S1 in the Web Design topic where they will use HTML to create basic webpages adding a variety of content to their pages. In addition they will develop their Software Development skills when they create their own games using programming constructs and download these onto hand held devices. They will also learn about Cyber Security and online threats and dangers as well as methods to ensure online safety.

Homework will be issued on a regular basis and pupil progress will be tracked using a variety of assessment methods.

FOOD, FASHION, DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

HOME ECONOMICS

In Home Economics, pupils are involved in both cookery and textiles lessons. In cookery, pupils have the chance to make a variety of dishes, including: sandwiches; shortbread; truffles; wraps; fruit smoothies; fresh fruit salad; coleslaw; hot chocolate; rice salad; cheesy beans; raspberry buns and rock buns.

Pupils can take home what they have made for those at home to sample!

Throughout the session, pupils work on various cookery skills and processes. In textiles, pupils follow a Ready Steady Sew course, where they make their own Minion puppet.

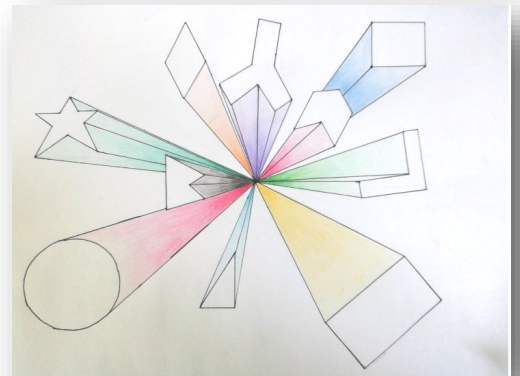

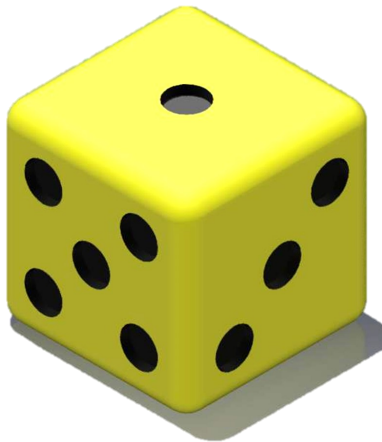
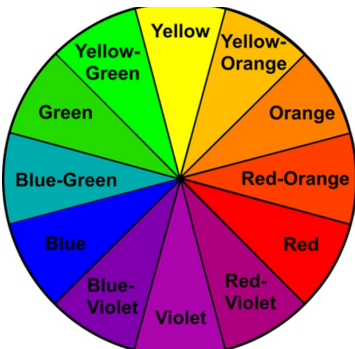
FOOD, FASHION, DESIGN & TECHNOLOGY

In **Design and Technology** we will build upon some of the skills and knowledge that you have already developed in primary school.

You will learn about the Design Factors and design your own Birdfeeder. You will learn all about Health & Safety in the workshop and be able to construct your model out of wood. We also teach you how to sketch geometric shapes and how to render and add texture.



You will build upon your new skills to design and make a plastic key tag, learn to use our 3D CAD modelling software and learn all about colour theory to prepare you for your final rotation.



We have linked up with RME so that you can finalise your project by learning how to use Desktop Publishing Software to create good quality leaflets.

PASTORAL

At Barrhead High School we want to make sure that everyone has the support they need.

Your Pastoral Teacher is the person you can go to if you have any concerns. As well as all your other classes, you have one class per week with your Pastoral Teacher. Your Pastoral Teacher can help you with anything:

Worries about classes

Issues with friends

Barriers to you coming into school

If you feel you need additional support

You must remember that you are never alone in Barrhead High and you always have support. Our Pastoral Office door is always open and you are more than welcome to come and speak to your Pastoral Teacher during break or lunchtime.

If your parents/ carers have any concerns or worries about your time in school they should always call the school and ask to speak to your Pastoral Teacher. We are always keen to hear from parents and there is no worry which is too small.

It's always important you speak to us because we can deal with situations if we know about them—if not then we can't help as quickly as we would like.

SUPPORT FOR LEARNING

We also want to make sure that we are getting it right for all our learners. We know that young people can find school difficult for lots of different reasons perhaps ...

Celebrating Success

As a school we recognise the importance of using social media to share and celebrate pupil achievement digitally. Using platforms such as Twitter and the school website, faculties will post regular updates celebrating pupil achievement.

Weekly achievements are shared at assembly and publicised on plasma screens around the school. These achievements are also shared monthly on the school website allowing us to celebrate with the wider community.

Each year group will have the opportunity to celebrate both academic and wider achievement during annual award ceremonies and the end of session 'Showcase' event. Our Celebrating Success Evening allows young people the opportunity to showcase their achievements and talents to our school community. This event takes place at the end of the year and pupils, families and staff are invited in to celebrate positive work from across the school, and experience some incredible performances.



Achievement

At the start of each new session a 'Fresher's Fayre' will be held to advertise the wide range of clubs and sports on offer to young people. Every year we have a comprehensive, inclusive and well planned extra-curricular programme that offers a wide variety of choice. All S1 pupils are encouraged to sign-up for at least 3 clubs before leaving the fayre.

Achievements include personal achievements, representing the school, pupil of the month, volunteering and participation in extra-curricular activities.

Young people have opportunities to recommend their peers to be recognised for achievements via the online form available on QR codes around the school and in google classrooms. An achievement page on the school website provides the opportunity for parents and carers to send achievements direct to the school.

FAQ

What time should my child come to school?

If your child aims to arrive by 8.30am this will ensure they have time to access the breakfast cart (free), lockers and visit the toilet before the bell at 8.40am. If your child arrives at class after 8.45 (2nd bell) they will be marked as late.

Where should my child meet staff on Day 1?

S1 will meet in the Games Hall and will have their first assembly and a period with their Pastoral Teacher. Staff and learners will be available to support.

When will they receive their timetables?

Your child will receive their timetable at the start of day 1. Once you have received details about Parent Portal and you have signed up, you will be able to view the timetable online.

What time will my child have their breaks?

Interval- 10.25-10.40 am

Lunch- 12.20-1.00pm

Will they need their PE kit on Day 1?

Your child will not require their kit on day 1. Please make sure your child checks their timetable each evening to plan their PE kit and equipment.

Who should my child speak to if they require help?

We want to empower all our young people. It is important that as your child moves to Barrhead High School that they develop confidence and resilience. If your child shares an issue please encourage them to come and speak to their Pastoral Teacher or a member of the Senior Management Team. We are here to help.

My child wants to cycle to school, where can this be stored?

At Barrhead High we have a bicycle shelter outside the school gates and some bike stands within the school gates. These are not monitored throughout the day and we recommend that all bikes are securely locked. All bikes are left at **owners own risk** and we cannot be held responsible for theft/vandalism.

FAQ

How will my child get lunch on day 1 if they do not bring lunch?

All young people will be issued with a pin number to access the canteen. We will organise a visit to the canteen at the start of the day.

If your child is a free school meal and you have applied via <https://eastrenfrewshire.gov.uk/free-school-meals> the funds will automatically be added at 11.30am.

If your child is not FME and would like to use the canteen they should bring funds to add to their account.

Your Parent Pay details will be sent ASAP to allow you to top up your account.

Can my child buy snacks?

The canteen sells snacks at morning interval. Please note, if your child is a free school meal their funds will not go on their account until after interval. This is to ensure they have funds for their lunch.

What happens if my child forgets to bring money or there is not enough funds in their account?

Your child would be informed by the canteen that they do not have enough funds in their account. They should visit the school office who will issue a green slip. Once they have the slip they do not need to wait in the queue again. The office will then send you an email to remind you to top up your account.

If your child is a free school meal and they have spent their allowance they will not be able to make further purchases. This is crucial to prevent families from accumulating debts.

Please note, SLT and Pastoral always have a selection of snacks and drinks. No young person should be hungry, they just need to ask for help.

What do they need in their pencil case?

The usual pens, pencils and ruler etc. You should also purchase a scientific calculator if you can, we will assist if your child does not have one.

How can my child access a locker?

Once Parent Pay is set up you will be able to pay £5 to secure a locker. You will receive an email to share that it is set up and the deadline for applying. Free School Meal learners do not need to pay, they will receive their locker keys on the same day as all other learners.

What should I do if my child has lost their locker key?

You will be able to pay £5 for a replacement key on Parent Pay. However, we do not check this on a daily basis; your young person must visit the office and share that you have paid.

How will I know if my child has homework?

In the new session, you will be invited to join Google Guardian for S1 pupils. Google Guardian is a fantastic resource that enables parents/ carers to have an overview of set homework, completion rates and up and coming tasks. This will allow you to further support your child with their learning, at home. More information will be shared on this in August.
