In the Gym Hall, there will be displays from all the classes in the School and Nursery showcasing their work on Science, Maths and Technology.



We are delighted to share with you details of our upcoming STEM week. We have an action-packed programme of activities where the children will be engaged in a variety of activities focusing on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics.

Here are some of the highlights:

Monday 24th March

We launch our week with Alex the Magician. Alex will conduct a series of shows and workshops highlighting uses of number strategies and patterns to amaze our children with Science in magic. He will also look at forces and balances.



Mrs Marsh from Williamwood High School will begin working with Primary 6 pupils on their Microscopy unit.

Mrs Lesley Dunne will be in school to share her Civil Engineering knowledge related to the very topical issue of flooding. She will work with classes to develop an understanding of flood prevention and flood alleviation.
