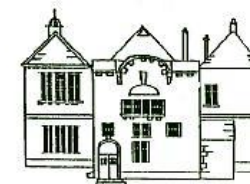

Family Centred Audit

As part of our work towards gaining 'Family Centred' accreditation for the school, we recently completed an audit on what we could do to make the school more welcoming for parents and visitors.

We did - You may have noticed the colourful and inspiring enhancements to the stairs in the main building. We have also updated the link corridor windows with beautiful pictures of our pupils. The sign in desk for visitors has been moved to a more central position. Please let us know what you think of our improvements.

Attendance

Parents are reminded that any holidays or trips taken during the school term will be marked as an unauthorised absence. We know that pupils' development and learning can be adversely affected by a poor attendance record so we urge you not to take your children out of school during term time. The school target for attendance has been set at 96.8%. In future, we will send out a kind reminder if your child's attendance slips below 97%.

Music Festival

Miss Cairnie and Mrs McLean are taking choirs to compete in the Glasgow Music Festival later this month. On Monday 14th March, Miss Cairnie's P1 and P2 choir will sing in the Royal Concert Hall. Their class begins at 11.45am. Mrs McLean's Music Making Group will perform on Tuesday 15th March at 10am. Parents are welcome to attend the performances. Tickets are available from the Concert Hall and cost £5 for an adult and £3 for children.

Second Level Show - Busby Roars

Class parts will be given out after the Spring break. The show will be performed at Eastwood Theatre on the evening of Thursday 2nd June.

Message from the Junior Road Safety Officers
