Planning

Room 1 are 'getting physical' and learning to share space and equipment with a variety of sports equipment.

Room 2 is basing their learning on 'What the Ladybird Heard' and developing an understanding of direction using maps.

Room 3 are having a focus on one of our favourite stories 'Stick Man', developing basic literacy and number skills such as rhyming, mark making and counting.

Pre-school children from room 1 did a fantastic job last term as pupil councillors helping with important jobs such as collecting the weekly contribution, shopping, watering plants, and making decisions such as voting on which nativity to perform.

They have now handed over to the preschoolers in room 2 who will take on the role this term.

Health Tips for this term – Detecting and treating head lice

Parking and Pupil Safety

The safety of our pupils is very important to us. A number of measures have been put in place in the car park to improve safety for all. At our whole school assembly at the start of the month children have been told not to cross the car park unless accompanied by an adult. It has been brought to my attention that a number of children have been running across the car park at the front of the school as a short cut to the entrance/exits. There are also a number of children who are running across the car park to get to a parked car, where the adult is waiting for them. Other children are crossing between cars that are parked in the drop off zone or on double yellow lines. Children have been asked to wait on the pavement/grass or path area until the adult who is there to collect them sees that they are waiting and comes out of the car to get them. We need all users of the car park help us to keep our children safe. Barrhead High's Campus police officer and community wardens will be assisting us monitor the use of the car park. This is to ensure the safety of all of our children and drivers.

Carlibar Creators (adults only)

We meet every Thursday 9.00 -11.40am & 1.00 -3.3.40pm in the Family room. Being part of the group is an opportunity to make new friends, learn and share skills and to find out what's on in the community. You don't need to have any special skills, we work and create as a team!
