Responsible User Agreement

Every year, class teachers will discuss the importance of being a responsible user and pupils and parents/carers will sign an agreement.

Pupils should:

- Keep usernames and passwords safe
- Never log on using another pupil's account details
- Do not share your personal details when using the Internet and email or anyone else's
- Only use the Internet for school work
- Only use personal devises with teachers' permission
- Show respect to others by not sending inappropriate messages, sound or visual materials.

If any pupil is found to be violating the agreement, action will be taken and Internet and email usage can be examined.

Bring Your Own Device (B.Y.O.D) in Crookfur

- Optional for P6 and P7 pupils only
- Pupils should only access Internet using pupil WIFI which has appropriate firewalls
- Pupils must adhere to the responsible user agreement at all times
- Mobile devices are for classroom use only, in the presence of the teacher and for a specific purpose. They are not allowed to be used in the playground or in any other areas within the school.
- At all other times and in all other classes, devices must be turned off and should be given to the class teacher for safe keeping
