### ***Weekly Round Up***

#### Staffing Update

The staff listed below will usually be the teachers who will work in your child's class. As part of teachers' contracts, they have time built into the school week when they do not teach. This is referred to as non-contact time or NCC. This session we have changed how teachers' non class contact time is organised. To minimise the number of adults working in different classes across the school day, we have arranged for non-contact time to be taken in a single block, rather than different lessons across the week. The NCC teacher (noted in the table below) will teach your child for one day every two weeks\*. Primaries 2, 3, 3/4, 4 and 5 will be taught by the NCC teacher in Week One and P1, P6 and P7 in Week Two. Week One and Week Two will alternate across the session, this week is Week One and week beginning 24<sup>th</sup> Aug is Week 2.

\* This varies slightly for P5A, who will have two half days per fortnight.

This year NCC teachers will plan project based interdisciplinary learning. Again, due to current restrictions, we are unable to continue with our Skills Academy model and so we have agreed that NCC teachers will base their planning around the skills academy experiences within a context relevant and interesting to the children.

#### Digital Devices

Thank you to all of the families who have returned chromebooks borrowed during the school closure. If you have any school devices at home, please return these to school as soon as possible. The device chargers are due an annual electrical test and once all of the devices are returned we will be able to make use of these for learning in school.

If any child is required to quarantine or self isolate, we will issue a device if it is needed to continue to support their learning at home.

### Family Centre Update

Construction work has resumed at our Family Centre site and we expect that a completion and handover date will be agreed soon. We will carefully plan the transition to the Family Centre and involve our children and families as much as possible. I am pleased that our children and staff have settled well in our neighbourhood nurseries but we are looking forward to being together again. I hope to be able to provide a more detailed update soon.

### Outdoor Learning

All classes will spend time learning outdoors and this will take place across our school grounds, including the woodland area. We have set up a timetable where classes will access some of the wilder areas in the grounds and we ask that on these days your child brings a pair of wellies (named) and an outdoor waterproof suit (or waterproof trousers and a jacket). Children in P1 and P2 may keep their wellies in school but P3-7 should bring their outdoor kits in a plastic carrier bag and take them home at the end of the day. P1 and P2 will need a plastic bag to take home their waterproof clothes.

Our fundraising committee has purchased some waterproof suits for younger children but if your child has any waterproof suits/trousers etc that they have outgrown we will happily take donations to issue out to others or keep as spares. We will of course adhere to all covid 19 guidance, ensuring any donations or borrowed items are quarantined and/or laundered before being given to children.

## First Aid

Our playgrounds are busy places and it is natural that we have bumps and falls during break and lunch. Small bumps and grazes are usually attended to in the playground by the supervising staff but where required, children will be sent to the medical room. A senior pupil or an adult will accompany younger children.

Where injuries are minor e.g. scraped knee, we would not usually telephone home or send a note. We will of course contact parents/carers if an injury needs further attention.

## Social Distancing

Children and staff have quickly adapted to our new routines and are becoming used to maintaining 2m distance in school, as well as practicing good tissue hygiene and regular hand washing.

I remind all parents/carers that they must adhere to guidance and maintain 2m distance from adults and other children. Where this is not possible, a face covering should be worn. I urge all parents/carers collecting at the end of the day to consider wearing a face covering if they are unable to maintain 2m distance around the school gates.



Only one parent is permitted to enter school grounds to drop off and collect children in P1 and P2. I ask that when you have collected your child that you leave the school grounds promptly.

Children should not stay and play at the end of the school day. I have been contacted by colleagues in Eastwood High School who have asked that children do not play within their campus at the end of the day. Thank you for your cooperation.
