Anti Bullying Week (16th – 22nd November)

Our school values underpin all that we do in Crookfur. We strive to create an environment that is safe, respectful and fair. All children should feel happy to come to school and feel that everyone is included and treated with kindness.

We work to foster a culture in school where bullying behaviour is unacceptable. We do not shy away from the fact that bullying exists and we are proactive in addressing this through our House System, promotion of school values and curriculum. Every single member of the Crookfur community has a responsibility to challenge bullying behaviour and to ensure that it is not tolerated on any level.

Next week is National Anti-Bullying Week and in classes across the school we will promote discussions and activities which allow the children to explore their feelings and ideas about friendship, respect, celebrating diversity and tackling bullying behaviour.

I ask for your support in reinforcing our anti-bullying messages. Please talk with your child to ensure that they are confident to speak out and tell an adult in school about behaviour that they feel is wrong. They may not want to challenge a peer or be seen to “tell the teacher” in which case I urge them to tell you and for you to report this to the school. Our children, staff and families all have a vital role to play.

In today’s assembly we also reminded children of our Wishes and Worries boxes. There are three placed across the school where children can post a slip to share their ideas or any concerns that they have.

Georgia is excited to join the Crookfur team and as she will be the first point of contact for many parent/carer enquiries, she will quickly get to know all of our families.
