Anti-Bullying Week

This week our focus on kindness, and the impact this can have on preventing bullying type behaviours, has been evident throughout the school. Our Primary 6 ambassadors have been excellent role models for our children and have delivered fun lessons to other classes. They are going to work with Mrs Slorach, and their class teachers, to make a kindness display with all the bunting and kindness posters that have been created. Primary 6 will also be leading with I am Me lessons next term.

In addition to the One Kind Word sessions being carried out, our Primary 7 children have created a kindness advent calendar. As with last year all members of the school will be encouraged to carry out an act of kindness each day in December. Primary 7 will be looking out for these acts of kindness and will be promoting them through sharing examples on our assembly, on Twitter and with announcements over the school tannoy.

Ukelele club

Next term Mrs Hutchison plans to run an after school ukulele club for children in Primary 6 and 7. This will run for about 8-10 weeks for a group of around 10 children.

In order for children to see if this is an instrument they would be interested in playing Mrs Hutchison will provide two taster sessions before the winter break. The taster session for Primary 6 will be on Tuesday 7th December at 1pm and for Primary 7 it will be on Tuesday 14th December at 1pm. If your child is interested finding out more about this instrument they can attend the taster session. Following this, we will issue them with a letter to apply for a place in the club. As with other clubs, if we are oversubscribed names will be picked at random. More details will be provided in a letter issued to those who are interested.

East Renfrewshire Larder - 12 Days of Christmas collection

We know that Christmas is a very expensive time of year and in these particularly challenging times, local residents are relying more and more on the support of the ER Larder.

On the 12 school days from 6th – 21st December we plan a daily collection for the Larder, with particular focus on household goods and toiletries.
