Remembrance Day

In our assemblies today, children shared their impressive knowledge about the history and significance of Remembrance Day. A two minute silence was beautifully observed across the school with children demonstrating our school value of respect.

House Captains did a fantastic job selling poppies for a donation to Poppy Scotland this week. We are delighted that all four boxes were sold out, with our donations providing vital life-changing support to the Armed Forces community in Scotland. Thank you.

Committee Update

Our Pupil Council are planning a project to build links with our local community. They have met with the organisers of the ER Larder and are working together to come up with ideas to support people in need.

The Rights Respecting Schools group plan to carry out an audit of our current approaches to supporting Children's Rights and will develop an action plan to help us gain accreditation as a Rights Respecting School. Across the school, children are already familiar with the UNCRC and have used this to create their class charters. The Right Respecting Group will help lead a range of new developments to support our journey towards further accreditation.

Our P5 Reading Buddies have had their first training session with Mrs McKim and will soon meet with their little buddies to help develop their reading skills and love of stories and books.

Book Week Scotland

Next week is Book Week Scotland and we have a range of exciting activities taking place across the week as we celebrate a love of books and stories across Crookfur!

To encourage children to read more stories, a group of Primary 5 pupils have devised a Class Reading Challenge. On Monday they will be delivering large charts to all classes for children to record any stories that they read across the week. On Friday the pupils will collect in the recording sheets and the class with the most stories/books recorded will receive a book token to purchase some new texts for their class library. The winning class will be announced at assembly.

Please encourage your child to read and enjoy lots of stories across the week, this could be with or to you and remind them to record these on their class sheet.
