apologies	Mrs Ferguson (P4/5 class teacher) also joined the meeting on 23/11/21 to share plans for the school's recognition of International Mother Tongue Day on Monday 21st Feb 2022.		
International Mother Tongue Day (R Ferguson)	Mrs Ferguson will lead a whole school international languages day. This will include a focus on mother tongue as well as cultural aspects. Some ideas for the celebration include: Children come dressed in the colours of a national flag, international buffet lunch in canteen, learn and perform a song in another language, learn a phrase e.g. a friendly welcome in another language, have some labels and signs across the school in multiple languages, table top displays etc.		
	From discussion we agreed that it would be a good idea to include languages spoken by children and families in the school as well as British Sign Language. In addition we will seek to offer a role to parents e.g. perhaps they could read a dual language story to a class or group of children (Covid restrictions permitting) A display was also suggested that could grow e.g. a paper tree with phrases that could be added to.		
	The group agreed this will be a very worthwhile, creative and inclusive experience for children which will help to celebrate diversity.

LGBT Inclusive Practice Gender Balance	We discussed the Scottish Government guidance issued around LGBT inclusive practice. We agreed that our school should focus on inclusion and recognising, valuing and supporting different family set ups. This can include same sex couples, single parent families and blended families as well as children who have been adopted or who are looked after by carers.			
	All parties agreed that it is important that all children and families feel that their lived experience is represented in the school. We are aware that some parents may feel that they need more information so as not to confuse their children or to come into conflict with their own beliefs.			
	The focus of the group will be to support the school to raise awareness and understanding within the school community through having conversations to normalise situations, promoting inclusive language and to introduce gentle change.			
	It was agreed that professional development for staff would be benewell as information sessions for parents/carers to find out more.			
	Jill advised that LGBT Youth Scotland have very good resource materials for school which could be accessed and that they are very willing to support schools on their improvement journey. Sheena will contact them.
